<u>Dummy on the Right</u> Is it Safe or Dangerous to Lead the Suit?

Safe Plays may lose but don't give away tricks Safe Surround Plays, you're on lead

You hold two honors higher the honor in dummy and a card below it Visualize remaining honors split between declarer and partner Lead second high forcing declarer to overtake or lose trick Expect partner to lead suit back to capture high card in dummy If everyone plays low, duck next round of suit
