

A five-notrump rebid by the Blackwood (or KCB) bidder confirms possession of all the aces (or of key cards if KCB), invites a grand slam, and asks for specific kings (bulk or specific)

Bidding: North's leap to 4D is a splinter jump showing a singleton diamond, strong spade support plus opening bid values. East's double of an artificial bid is lead directing. South has a perfect hand for slam: nothing wasted in diamonds.

## Deal 3

North Deals

5NT when only one possible trump suit has been bid asks:

- Bid grand slam with two of the top three trump honors.
- Else, six agreed-suit without two of the top three trumps


## Elaborate Alternative:

- Bid grand slam with two of the top three trump honors. Else:
- 6*: Ace or King (Axxxxxx or Kxxxxxx)
- 6»: Queen (Qxxxxxx)
- 60: worst trumps possible (Jxxxxxx)

With a lesser trump holdings, direct return is weakest. If South had $\triangle A x x$, only $\triangle$ King (not $\triangle Q$ ) would be of interest.


A jump to five-notrump bid in a notrump-only auction invites a grand slam. (37 points for grand slam.)

## Opener can:

- bid 6NT with minimum.
- bid 7NT with maximum.
- bid 6 of good suit to suggest an alternative strain.

Opener cannot pass.

After two strains have been bid, 5NT is forcing and asks Partner to pick the best slam.

South starts with $4 \uparrow+2 \odot+3 \diamond+0 \%=$ nine winners and can promote two \& tricks. (That's eleven.) What can be done with $\odot$ and/or $\diamond$ to get a twelfth trick? Does South play a role?

5NT shows solid aces or keycards depending on system played Forcing to small slam and invites 7
6 H shows number of Ks (excluding trump K depending of system(
With a source of tricks can make 7 missing 1 K
Deal 2
North hand: S: K 4 2; H: A 54 2; D: K 2; C: K QJ 3
"?" bid is 7C
Jump to 5NT is quantitative; forces to small slam, invites to 7
6 C bid says I'm not sure of 7 (probably 16 points)but I have C assets
Deal 3
North hand: S: 3 2; H: K Q 654 3; D: 3 2; C: 32
"?" bid is 5NT GSF; N bids 7H
Deal 4:
5NT pick-a-slam cannot be passed.
Endplay to force H or D dicard
Deal 6
5NT forcing to slam, help me pick it
"?" bid is 6C - I have delayed support for your Cs
Pass = Cs look better than NT
Deal 7
"?" bid is 6D, I have extra D length
