The *Kibitzer's* First 40 Years by Jerry Smith with Elinor Tanck

When the Board of Directors decided in 1963 that the Unit should publish a monthly newsletter, it was agreed that the publication ought to be provided without cost to all Unit members in good standing. It should be as interesting a vehicle, as we could manage, containing "something for everyone." It is remarkable that for 40 years this policy has remained intact. The only things that have changed are the technological aspects of the production of the publication. In 1963 our typists produced crude typewritten copy which we cut-and-pasted to produce "masters," which were then reproduced by offset press or Xerox-type copy machines, and hand-collated and stapled. Today, we use sophisticated desktop publishing computer software and color printers to produce a much more elegant product. The "something for everyone" policy required first and foremost, publicity for upcoming bridge events and winners of Unit events. The next in order of importance were items regarding governance, club directors, playing accommodations, etc.

To humanize all of this dull stuff, we thought we needed a "gossip" column to report on both the bridge and non-bridge foibles of Unit members. Thus we created the *Table Talk* column, which has turned out to be the longest standing of all the *Kibitzer* features. Shirley Jones was the first columnist, followed by Mary Lampman (March 1965), then Faith Feldman (October 1967), Dick McClellan (May 1969), Barbara Vetterlein (December 1969), Marta Cordell (August 1970), and Berta Krop (March 1973). In July, 1973, a fresh new face appeared on the scene, British-born Carol Ineson, whose unique *Table Talk* style brightened the *Kibitzer* pages for three wonderful years until she was killed tragically in a shocking private airplane crash near Tahoe along with three others of our Unit members.

In one of her early articles Carol wrote the following: "The trouble with writing this column as I am sure my predecessors long ago discovered and are laughing at me for having failed to spot before, is that all my best material is unprintable."

Carol's shoes were nearly impossible to fill, but yours truly and others worked at it until in December 1976 the column went anonymous, using the pseudonym "Edgar Allen Ho Ho." Why this particular appellation, we have forgotten. Was it possibly to cover the writer's ineptitude? This nom de plume was replaced with another one, "Queen of Hearts" in July, 1984, and with the by-line *Table Talk* appeared regularly until June 1987. After a 16-month hiatus the column was revived in October 1988 but without a by-line, appearing sporadically from that time on, seemingly not ever able to recover from the loss of its real queen, Carol Ineson.

From the beginning we felt it was important to include technical material in our newsletter, to satisfy the desire of our members for combined entertainment and education. The Unit has always been blessed with a plethora of outstanding bridge talent, so with a little arm twisting here and there over the years we were able to produce a lot of good copy. Perhaps the most outstanding of this material was a feature modeled after The *Bridge World* magazine's Master Solvers Club. Beginning in December 1967 Steve Levy and Ron Promboin, two of our most distinguished players, hosted a feature they named "I Double!!!!" The gimmick employed was to submit bidding problems to a panel of Palo Alto Unit experts and present their answers and discussions thereof in the subsequent issue. This feature appeared until October 1970 in this format, after which Steve and Ron switched to a tutorial type format covering a broad range of subjects, which they *(continued on next page)*

wrote until April 1971. The quality of these articles was top grade, and our lucky Unit members, I'm sure, improved their playing abilities substantially by reading them. We had many other writers as well over the years, in fact so many we would no doubt omit some if we tried to list them all. Frank Savstrom started us off with a series he wrote for the earliest issues of the Kibitzer. And then there were articles by Grant Baze, Jim Nelson, Harry Rubenstein, Ed Barlow, Bob Melosh, Bob Sanner, John White, Peter Kamas, and Gersh Wheeler, as well as Yours Truly and others. I sometimes think, wouldn't it be great to gather all these together and preserve them in a book, our very own Palo Alto Unit creation? It would be a "good read."

In addition to technical articles, the Kibitzer has also offered frequent articles on Conduct and Ethics. Many of these were little "sermonettes," a fraction of a column or so of text, some longer, the whole idea being to raise the conscience level of our players thus enhancing everybody's enjoyment of the game. Writers over the years include

Nancy Bulf in the early days, Cap Crossley, June Madison, Grace Foley, and numerous others. This work has had a more or less direct tie-in to the annual Sportsmanship Trophy award, which has been publicized in the *Kibitzer* every year since publication began.

Early on, the *Kibitzer* policy was to limit the publishing of winners names to Unit events, but after some seven years there was pressure to try to give the club winners more publicity, and the *Winners Circle* feature was initiated in December 1971. For 17 faithful years Sam Lief managed the collection and col-

lation of winners' names from all the Unit clubs, and he died only months after he resigned. Bobbie Delano picked up the slack after Sam's resignation and continued the work until February 1991. Since then the *Winners Circle*, currently compiled by Alan Templeton, has continued to this day without a by-line.

In addition to the above we might mention the Unit membership articles describing the "state of the Unit" which became an annual tradition beginning in 1966. There have also been myriad bits and pieces such as letters to the editor (with editorial responses), cartoons, word puzzles, poems and nonsense articles, "Just for Juniors" features, memorials, personality sketches by Jerry Jones, assorted borrowed materials from other bridge publications, etc.

The account given above gives only a brief summary of the *Kibitzer's* 40-year. Grateful recognition goes to the many Unit volunteers, who served on the editorial staff including Jerry Smith (1963-79, 1984-91), Faye Reeder, Carol Ineson, Pat Carrington (1980-84), Bobbie Delano (1986-92) and currently Elinor Tanck (1972-) and Lori Spaeth (1991-). We also wish to acknowledge those who have made significant contributions to the *Kibitzer* production including Eleanor McCarthy (1971-88), Pat Carrington (1984-90), Emily Jacoby (1992-97), Lorna Corbetta (1997-01), Frank Frates (1997-99) and currently Jim Turner (1990-) and Ethel Worcester (1999-). There are many others whom we have failed to name who lent a hand in producing our Unit newsletter. Clearly we are limited as to the time, space, and patience necessary to carry this presentation any further, but for those who have the interest, the Unit maintains *Kibitzer* archives, at the Bridge Center, which make for some fascinating browsing.



When the Kibitzer was young, I did an article on this subject in August, 1963. Today we run into experts, or very good players at most of the clubs. I am offering my tips for playing against very good players again. These ideas will be based on common sense.

- 1. Play your normal game. If you should double, then do so. If you should bid on, then do so. If everyone else is bidding and making 4 Spades, then playing and making 3 Spades against best defense will be the same bottom as going down at 4 Spades. Besides, experts cannot turn deuces into aces.
- 2. Use count and attitude signals only when necessary, since good declarers know how to read these signals also. When we come to the last few cards of a hand, partner should know what is going on most of the time without signals. One caution is that it is unethical to have a private understanding about your signals, such as having all signals be false cards against a particular opponent. You can false card, but partner should be at risk as well as declarer.
- 3. If making a hand depends upon an error by the opponents, then play for it. If there is a legitimate chance as well, then prefer that line against strong opponents, since they will make fewer errors than normal.
- 4. Preemptive bids tend to convert a hand into a guessing game, so they will reduce the advantage a strong pair has. Therefore, be a little bit freer with your preemptive bids. Any pair is better if they can make system bids than if they have to improvise.

Local Team Scores Again by Tom Snouse

Despite an onslaught of champions from Sweden, Russia, Poland, Turkey, France, Italy, Pakistan and, believe it or not, the Bay Area, Americans scored well in the biggest money bridge tournament in the world - the Cavendish. The Cavendish takes its name from a famous London bridge club where money changed hands nightly in wads of very large bills. And so it did this last weekend. Players were auctioned to the highest bidder for sums ranging from \$40,000 to a paltry \$1,250. This created prize pools totaling over one million. As you might imagine, not many players invited to this prestigious event had better things to do that weekend.

Held at the fabulous Mirage Hotel Convention Center in Las Vegas, 12 teams and 74 pairs played in three events. America's top ranked player, Paul Soloway, was there. France sent Paul Chemlia, a perennial international champion. Italy had so many entrants it was rumored they bought airfare as a tour. Even Floridian Benito Garrozzo, a member of the legendary Italian Blue Team, attended.

Rose Meltzer and Peter Weichsel of Los Gatos, winners of the last large International event, the Bermuda Bowl, headed the Bay area contingent. From the East Bay, Rita Shugart and Andy Robson of Carmel attracted the minimum bid of \$12,500 in their pairs event, and unfortunately managed to fulfill their backers' expectations to the hilt. Lou Ann O'Rourke, formerly of Portola Valley, had similarly poor luck in the teams. But the Meltzer team with Chip Martel and Lew Stansby from the East Bay finished third to take home 25 grand.

Brad Moss of New York City and Fred Gitelman of Canada won the pairs event and needed an extra piece of luggage to haul home their winnings. It was rumored that they may have suffered ligament damage as a result of their exuberant victory dance. Mike Moss, holder of many national titles, Brad's father, was one of the originator's of this tournament in 1975. Brad has the right genes. His mother, Gail Greenberg, and his sister, Jill Levin, are world champions. Gitelman, who produces high-quality bridge software, last year moved from Toronto to Las Vegas, a magnet for experts these days.

Walid El Ahmady and Tarek Sadek from Turkey were the surprise finishers in second place. It was a small surprise, they finished second last year as well. More information about this remarkable event can be found at www.thecayendish.com
