## It Seems to Me <br> by Gersh Wheeler

Here is a highly instructive hand.

| North | South |
| :--- | :--- |
| S KJ86 | S AT972 |
| H J2 | H 43 |
| D K543 | D A62 |
| C 765 | C J4 |

1. East is the dealer and opens 1 H . After aggressive bidding by both sides, EW reach 4 H and you, South bid 4S. No one is vulnerable. EW doubles. Your opponents take 2 heart tricks and 2 club tricks. You trump the third club and you still have to lose a diamond trick.

If the opponents can make 4 H , down 2 would be a good save, but down 3 would be a bottom. If the opponents, would go down in 4 H , you've already got a bottom. Thus, to have any hope for a good score, you must assume the opponents will make 4 H . This means they will lose 2 diamond tricks and only 1 spade. So, you must assume that their spades are divided 3-1. You must lay down one high spade and then finesse for the SQ. From the bidding, you may have some idea as to who has the singleton.
2. Now consider how you would play the hand, if you are not doubled. Probably, few EW pairs will be in game and most may be allowed to play in 2 H or 3 H . They will make +140 , if their spades are 2-2 and +170 , if they are 3-1. So you should play the SA and SK. If the spades are 2-2, you'll go down 2 tricks for -100 , which is better than losing 140. If the spades are $3-1$, you'll lose a spade trick for 150 , but EW could make +170 . By the way, in the first case, if you have no idea, who has the singleton, use Wheeler's rule. This states that, if you are playing against a mixed pair, the lady holds the Q . This is right about $50 \%$ of the time. This is obviously better than other guesses, which are wrong $50 \%$ of the time!
