Unit Continues to Grow by Elinor Tanck

The Unit extended its trend of increasing membership with a total of 689 members as listed by the ACBL in October of 2004, an increase of 1.9% from 2003. Easy Bridge and the Unit Lesson programs fostered this growth.

According to 2004 data, the active membership increased 0.74%, ranking 9th of 19 in District 21. The new member gains were 6.6%, 11th in D-21; the member losses 6.4%, 8th in D-21 and the new member retention in year two, averaged 63% over the last 3 years, 7th in D-21. The average member age is 66 and the average years of ACBL membership are 12.

Sherie Greenberg leads the master point list with 6108, followed by Don Rothschild with 5797, Gary Macgregor with 5752 and Peter Friedland with 5568. The player closest to the average master point total is Doreen Hornback with 526 and A. Trigg is at the median point with 164.

An Unusual Ending

The International Fund Game hand record analysis remarked that after East opens 1C and West responds 1S, North is sure to preempt. If North settles for 3H, neither East nor West will have enough values to act. The rest of the analysis deals with defending against a heart contract. East, however, had not yet seen the hand analysis and chose to risk a 3NT call. This led to an unusual sequence of plays. See if you can spot it.

South obediently led the H5 to the K and A. Aside from communication problems, declarer seems to have a shortage of winners. Perhaps the defense will help out. At trick two, declarer floated the SQ, winning. Then a low club to South's Q. South led D2, T, K, A. Another club puts South on lead with an unappetizing choice of leads. The DJ, since it was known, seemed the best

shot. (The 6 is no better. North can win with the 8 and set up hearts but a fourth round of diamonds puts South back on lead, with a choice of giving declarer his ninth trick in either spades or clubs.) Declarer ducked the J and South had no choice, but to continue diamonds. The D6 went to the D7 on the board. Declarer then cashed the DQ, the SA and led a spade to South's now bare K. South had to lead away from the C9 into declarer's K8. Making 3 with 2 S, 2 H, 3D and 2 clubs. Whew! All that work for 400 when a double of 3H might have yielded 500.

There may be a way to defeat 3 NT. If so, this is a candidate for the perennial question, would you rather play or defend? Did you spot why the hand was unusual? South was end played four times. Most irritating!!

NAP Games Get Underway

The ACBL invites players to participate in qualification games for the <u>N</u>orth <u>A</u>merican <u>P</u>air tournament. Local clubs may hold these games during the months of June through August. This will give players a chance to move up to the next level of qualification and to earn extra master points.

To increase participation in the NAP, the ACBL has reduced sanction fees and allows clubs to schedule two qualifying events. Watch the Kibitzer for these opportunities to pile up the points.

Players who place in the overalls earn sectional rated half red and half black master points. Any player who scores average or in the upper half in their respective strata will be eligible to play in a two-session Unit final to fulfill the requirements for the District matches.
