## Gersh Wheeler - A Superstar in our Midst

As Woody Hayes, the great football coach from the Ohio State Buckeyes once said, "When the ball goes into the air, three things can happen - and two of them are bad!" This is how I feel about writing my tribute to Gersh. Chances are I will fail to mention one of his myriad accomplishments.

Gersh has been playing bridge a very long time. He may not have numbered in the Barry Crane 500, but he certainly had an incredible run at the Regional level. He learned whist as a boy of eight and began playing bridge a few years after it was conceived in 1925. He joined the ACBL in 1937 but immediately resigned because of its racist policy of limiting membership to only whites.

For those of you who know Gersh, he represents to us Californians the consummate Eastern gentleman and scholar. Indeed, his undergraduate degree was from Harvard in Astronomy, which he coupled with two more Harvard advanced degrees in Education and Law. His educational background afforded him many career paths. He taught

private school in Miami Beach and, after retirement, taught part time at Ohlone College for 25 years. During World War II he helped develop radar at MIT's Radiation Lab. Subsequently he worked at Raytheon in Boston and Sylvania in Mountain View. At 50 he wrote a text on microwaves, and this was followed by 6 other publications. Although I had to pry it from his lips, he confessed to holding 9 patents of which he humbly admits only 2 are important.

What a treat it is for us to have Gersh continue to play at our club. For those of you East-Wests who play at his table, you know he is one terrific competitor. For those N-S who don't play against him, you are missing his very wry wit, good-natured chatter and sardonic humor - not to mention the never-ending stream of bidding quizzes. Trust me when I tell you he is definitely still way at the top of his game, and we relish trying to keep up. We love you Gersh!

*Editorial Note: Most Unit players are familiar with his bridge columns for the Kibitzer since day one. The first of his ongoing series "It Seems to Me" appeared in June 1996. The editors include his columns whenever there is space available.*

## It Seems to Me

Bidding above the level of game requires logical thinking and rarely needs artificial conventions. Here are a few examples:

1. My partner was dealer and bids 1S, the next player bid 2H. I bid 5S. My partner passed! The opponents took 2 heart tricks and my partner took the rest, making his contract. The 5S bid was a logical bid, which said, "I have 2 losers in the opponent's suit. If you have second-round control or better, bid the slam."

2. I opened the bidding 1H. Partner bid 5H. This is different from the preceding case, because there was no opponent's suit in the bidding. Here the 5H bid means, "We have enough for slam, but I have no controls in the trump suit. Because, I had AJT96 in hearts, I bid 6 and hoped I would catch either the king or queen. As it happened, the opposing trump broke 2-2, so I made the slam.

3. Partner dealt and opened 2C (strong). Next player bid 2S. I passed. The other opponent bid 4S. Partner bid 5D. Next player bid 5S. Now what would you do with each of the two following hands?

Hand A Sxxx, Hxxxx, Dxxx, Cxxx

Hand B SAxx, Hxxxx, Dxxx, Cxxx

With hand A, you must tell partner that there's no hope of making a slam, so you double. With hand B, partner might be able to make 6, but not if he has a spade void. Your best action is to pass. Because you did not double, partner knows you have a possible trick, which can only be the spade Ace.

4. My left hand opponent was dealer and opened the bidding with 4D. After my partner passed, the next opponent bid 5D. I had a tremendous hand and bid 6D. My partner held: S6432 HA9754, D3, C654. Partner knows I want him to bid 6H or 6S, if he has a four-card suit and no tricks. Because he has an A, he bid 7H, which he made easily.

## Gersh's Puzzler

The solution to last month's puzzler: Play the ace of clubs, pitching your queen of spades. Next, play the eight of spades and if west pitches a heart or east pitches a heart or club, you have the rest of the tricks!
