



Unit Lists Bridge Double Header for Sept. 11



The Unit will hold a Unit Open Pairs game and a two-session NAP Unit Final on Sunday, September 11 at the Bridge Center. In the NAP, the first session is at 1 p.m.; the second to be announced at the game. Overall winners in all flights will receive a mixture of red-gold points. This is a stratified flight A, B, C event for players who qualified in club NAP games by scoring average or better or finishing in the upper half of their respective flights. Consult the bulletin board at the Bridge Center or contact the individual directors if you are unsure whether you have qualified or not. Also eligible are pairs made up of life masters, who joined ACBL before 1996.

This event will qualify pairs, who score average or in the upper half, for the District 21 final: Flt A Jan. 14-15, Flt B Dec. 17, Flt C Jan. 15, all at the Bayshore BC in Burlingame.

If you did not qualify or choose not to participate in the NAP, please join the Unit Game at 1 p.m. which will be held simultaneously with the first session of the NAP. All Move, Please. No table talk during play! All of us, from experts to novices, occasionally take a long time to bid, play, or defend a tough hand. I don't think that anyone wants to prevent players from thinking a hand through, but when any players get behind, it slows the whole field. If you get behind, whether or not it's your fault, you can show courtesy to the rest of the players by not adding to the delays with extraneous conversations. When the director calls the move and the last hand is not finished, please don't engage in lengthy (or any) postmortems. If you know that you are running late, please don't get into a discussion between hands. If you start a round late, please start the new round promptly and not go on discussing the last round. If a director has to talk to you repeatedly about delaying the game, then you might give some thought to whether you might be abusing the schedule and being unfair to your fellow players. Your consideration will add to everyone's enjoyment of our favorite past time.

Easy Bridge. The Palo Alto Unit is sponsoring Easy Bridge, an ACBL program, on Friday mornings from 9 a.m.- 12 noon. at the Bridge Center. Because of the influence of a pleasant experience at Easy Bridge, there has been an increase in ACBL membership. Each session, led by Carla Davis, consists of a 20-minute lesson followed by 2 hours of play. The cost of each session is \$6. Easy Bridge is for players of all ages with some bridge experience, who want to be able to play and do not have to find a partner, or even worse, need three others to make up a table of bridge. Each session consists of 12 hands with awards of fractional masterpoints. This class is a learning experience; therefore players can request help with problem hands. Hearts are trumps. South to play and make 4 of the 5 tricks. See answer below.

Play club Ace and discard a spade from dummy. Play club 2. West wins.; discard a spade from dummy. West must now lead another club. Discard a spade from dummy and trump in your hand.

It Seems to Me—More on Transfers by Gersh Wheeler

You open 1NT. Partner bids 2D. You bid 2H. Now partner bids 2NT or 3NT. The 2 NT shows a willingness to play in game, if you have a maximum notrump opening. The 3NT wants to be in game with any kind of no-trump opening. Both of these bids indicate that partner has a five card heart suit and doesn't know if you have more than two hearts. With only two hearts and a minimum no-trump, pass the 2NT rebid, with two hearts and a maximum bid 3NT, with three hearts and a minimum bid 3H, with three hearts and a maximum bid 4H.

This is all straightforward, but what do you do if an opponent interferes? Consider the sequence: 1NT P 2D 2S. Now what do you do? Partner could have zero points. I suggest that with four hearts you bid 3H. Even if partner has zero points, you won't be hurt too much with a nine-card fit and opponents probably have a game. So, if you don't have four hearts, you pass. Partner bids 2NT or 3NT. These bids should have the same meaning as they would have, if the opponent had not bid. But, do they show a spade stopper? I would suggest that they show a stopper and that you use a double to show the equivalent of the 2NT bid without a stopper. But, some might prefer the double for penalties and use the no-trump bid with no stopper as in Lebensohl.

Obviously, you and your partner should discuss this situation and agree on a course of action. You should extend your course of action to cover other variations, such as 1NT P 2D 3C or 1NT P 2D 2H (cue bid).
