Hamish's 10 Ideas to Improve your Game (part 1 of 2)

Lori Spaeth has been after me to write an article for you, the members of the Palo Alto Unit. She gave me the leeway to choose my own subject. I decided to write on ten points which may help you in both improving and enjoying your duplicate bridge games at the club or your social rubber bridge at home or after golf.

My first five points concern the mental or "ambiance" attributes for winning bridge. The last five, which will appear in a future issue of the Kibitzer, are more helpful in improving your technique.

Point #1 A Good Attitude

Try to be optimistic. Feel confident that your finesses will work; that the trumps will break. This gives confidence to your partner and no help to your opponents. When I notice a pessimistic declarer looking at dummy, it gives me heart that we might beat this contract. During the game, if things go wrong, put it behind you. Similarly, if things go really well, put that behind you too. Thinking about the last hand causes loss of concentration on the present hand; this leads to mistakes. It helps if you get a good start to the game; so try hard to be sharp at the beginning. A good start helps "your attitude."

Point #2 Try to be a Partner that can be Trusted

This is very important especially in competitive auctions; i.e., part-score battles or when the bidding gets to the five-level or higher. The questions that cross my mind in these situations are "does my partner have her values?" or "Was her two-level overcall sound?" "Does she have a reverse?" If you are known as being a sound bidder, your results will improve. You will qualify as "my kind of partner." This "trust" applies critically whenever you are on defense. Are you sure that your partner is following your carding methods? Have you discussed when to give count, when to show attitude or suit preference? Good partnerships trust each other's card play. It solves the problem "do you trust your partner play or is declarer false carding?"

Point #3 Be Sensible and Reasonable

Bad boards occur when a player "takes a shot." Frequently, you bid (say) a game that goes down one or two tricks. I always look at the dummy and ask myself "is this a reasonable contract?" If it is, others will be in it and down one will be average or even better, if some go down two. If it is not reasonable, down one will be close to a bottom board. Being sensible applies particularly on defense. On opening lead against (say) a 1NT - 3NT contract, do not try to "hit a home run" with Kx, Axx, J87xx, 10xx by leading the spade king. It "may" work but you will get a poor result if it does not. Fourth best of your longest suit is a time tested method that is "sensible" and usually best.

Point #4 No gimmicks

K.I.S.S or "keep it simple, stupid." I really like to play the "Yellow Card" with new or strange partners. Many love to have the latest conventions on their card to cover certain situations that occur "once in a while." These players have a collection of crutches upon which they rely, and hope to confuse the opposition into mistakes. Usually they just confuse themselves. I am not an advocate of (complicated) conventions

In your bidding box there is a red card marked "STOP". This card is used to prevent transmission of unauthorized information. Consider the problem. Your opponent opens the bidding with a preempt or makes a jump overcall. If you pass immediately, your partner knows you don't have much to think about. Alternatively, if you hesitate and then pass, your partner knows you have some points but no clear overcall.

The stop-card solves the problem, if used correctly. If you are about to make an opening bid at a level of two or more or are about to make a jump overcall, first place the stop-card on the table. Then make your bid. Leave the stop-card on the table for at least ten seconds to give your opponent time to figure out whether to bid, pass or double. When you return the stop-card to the box, your opponent can then make a call without hesitation.

If your opponent uses the stop-card, begin your thinking when he bids, not when he picks up the card. Now you can make your call as soon as he picks up the stop card.

You do not have to use the stop-card, but the ACBL has specified that if you use it for some bids, you must use it for all preempts or jump bids.

I use those that help to establish game going values at a low level, e.g. 2 over 1, xyz, two-way new minor forcing and fourth suit forcing to game. In my classes I have found students who use methods different to mine but have the same principle. Inverted Swiss versus Jacoby 2NT is an example. We may discuss the pros and cons, but I tell the class that, if (say) Inverted Swiss works for them, keep on using it. Likewise, Flannery and Puppet Stayman do not work for me. I have never had a problem of bidding a hand with four spades and five hearts; thus, no Flannery. Puppet Stayman over 2NT may have value, but usually if I have a five card major and open in No Trump, my hand looks like a no-trump and not a suit contract hand. Also, opening 2NT with a five card major often is a "slam-killer" when slam in a minor suit may be available.

Point #5 Finally, in this section; "Be a good Partner"

Try to be encouraging when things go wrong. Everybody makes mistakes. Your partner feels badly when he or she does something wrong. So, it is your job to forget it and make sure your partner does too. Bridge is like golf; when you shoot a double bogey, you have to recover and make a few pars and, hopefully, a birdie or two.
