

Questions first, answers follow.

THOSE DARN COMPUTER HANDS by Eric Mayefsky

You don't have to play bridge at a club for very long before you hear stories about those demons of duplicate, computer dealt hands. Not long ago, pre-dealt hands were a beast only encountered at sectionals, regionals, and STAC week; but, as club owners discover the advantages of pre-dealt hands, they are becoming a weekly feature in more and more club games.

This leads to an obvious question. Why do those fiendish directors set up hands where every finesse is off, or where you're dealt an eight-card spade suit only to find your right hand opponent has the other five? The answer is equally obvious. They don't.

Despite what many players think, that hand you played last week where you needed to finesse the club nine at trick two wasn't put there by your director to challenge you. The randomly dealt computer hands are, honest to goodness, completely random. Bridge is a game of percentages. If players came to expect hands engineered to have bad breaks and losing finesses, the game's integrity would vanish almost instantly.

And, if you've always believed the hands the ACBL sends out for STACs and other special games are rigged, forget about it. According to the ACBL, only two people see those hand records before they're sent, and neither one of them knows how to play bridge.

However, if you can't shake the feeling that you've run into a few too many "crazy" hands when the cards are predealt, you may not be losing your mind. Why? Because the computer hands are truly random, and the shuffle-and-deal hands at your favorite club usually aren't. A deck needs to be shuffled six or seven times for a random deal to occur; instead, cards are usually shuffled two or three times, leaving suits in clumps (which in turn leads to flatter distributions when hands are dealt). So, unusual distributions should be happening more than you might think.

So, next time you run into a 5-0 trump break, don't blame the director or the computer. Just remember that trumps will break 5-0 for everyone else in the room, too; and with hand records, at least you can prove to your partner later that even though you went down you played the hand like an expert.




It Seems to Me by Gersh

Do you worry about your discards, when declarer is running a long suit and thus ignore your partner's discards? Here is a hand that came up at a regular duplicate game:

I, South, opened one no trump (15-17). Partner bid three no trump, closing the bidding. West led the spade queen and East played the ace. I dropped the four because it was nearest my thumb. Then East led the spade five which I took with my king. Now I took eight tricks in the minors. West was concerned that if I had the heart king, then two heart discards would be fatal. So West discarded spades leaving this situation:



I led the heart ace from dummy and East played the eight. Now East had to win the next trick with the king. On the thirteenth trick East led the deuce of spades, and I won the trick with the three!

West was correct to worry about whether I had the heart king. But before the eighth minor card was played I had shown 15 HCP; thus I could not have the heart king since my opening bid showed, at most, 17 HCP. Thus, West could have safely held a high spade and QJ of hearts.

East was also guilty. Had he paid attention to partner's discards, he would have known that West had no more spades and must be holding three hearts to the queen. East should have dropped the king under my ace of hearts, and West would win the last two tricks.
