# Spring Ahead to Unit IMP Pairs March 11

The Unit has scheduled a stratified pairs game with IMP scoring on Sunday, March 11 at 1 p.m. This is an opportunity for players to have a go at participating in an event different from matchpoints. Come with your smile and be ready to greet your opponents by name. This will be easy because there will be name tags for everyone.

An IMP Pairs event is played like a regular pairs event but is scored in a totally different way. A basic score is set for each board—usually an average of all the scores compiled on that board. Sometimes the top and bottom scores are eliminated before the average is taken so that extreme scores will have less impact on the average. Then your score is algebraically compared with the average and translated into International Matchpoints (IMPs) according to the IMP formula. The IMP scale is printed on the ACBL convention card.

An IMP event is an intermediate stage between match points and rubber bridge. The *Bridge Encyclopedia* states that IMP scoring favors bidding vulnerable games, recommends competing or balancing at the two-level, as in matchpoints, but not at the threelevel. Odds are not so good for sacrifices against game contracts. Play par bridge i.e., taking everything which is yours without trying to steal what belongs to the enemy. Save your overbidding for match points.

We anticipate good attendance at this fun event so please look for sign up sheets at your club. Although the strategy may sound complicated, you'll do just fine if you bring your best game to the table. We will have a separate game for 99ers. Carla Davis will direct the 99er game.

# It Seems to Me

By Gersh

Here is a hand that has a hidden problem. I've shown the hand to many of our players, and almost invariably I get the response, "Is there a point to this?"

North is the dealer and bids 1C. There is no adverse bidding. You respond 1S. Now North forgot that he opened and gets excited by his excellent spade support, so he re-bids 3S. Naturally you bid 4S.

West leads the DA and K and continues with a small diamond to East's Q. You trump. Now your first consideration is to get a new partner, but you have to play out the hand. You are in a contract of 4S with only 21 high card points in the combined hands. Surely no other pair will bid game. So if you go down, you will get zero on the hand, and whether you make four or five, you will get a top. How do you plan the play?

Most players see two finesses and hope one of them works. So they immediately play a trump on the fourth trick and finesse. The subtle point of the hand is that you cannot tell how to play the spades until you know whether the heart finesse works. So for the fourth trick you must lead a club to dummy and then take the heart finesse.

If the heart finesse wins, now you can afford to lose a trick in spades. If you try the spade finesse, and it loses to a singleton K, you will lose a second spade trick. You must play the A on the first spade trick. If nothing good happens, return to your hand and lead another spade. If the K is in the West hand, you still lose only one spade trick; ditto for any 2-2 split of the spades. You've given up a chance to make five, but you've avoided the danger of a singleton K in the East hand.
