You open with a bid of one in a suit. Partner responds at the one-level. You bid three of your original suit. In standard systems, this jump rebid is invitational, but not forcing. In theory, there are other bids available if you want to force. But this is not true if your suit is clubs. Suppose you hold six or seven clubs and three in each major and you have eighteen or nineteen high card points. You open 1C, partner bids 1S, and now you are stuck. You can't bid 2NT with a singleton or void in diamonds. In standard practice, you don't have any forcing bid available.

To solve this problem I recommend using the 3C rebid as a force. I have used this convention with a few partners with satisfactory results. It has some minor drawbacks, but solves a lot of problems.

To recapitulate: a jump rebid in clubs is forcing. In any other suit, it is invitational
