


BEGINNING BRIDGE CLASSES TO START SEPT. 6

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Mou-chin Chen

Gas prices around here getting too high? Perhaps it's time to call upon one of our nonagenarians—Mou-chin Chen.

Mou-chin, born and educated as a chemist in China, worked there during the Second World War in a factory making alcohol to use as a fuel. After the war, his job sent him to Taiwan,

newly liberated from Japanese rule, where he managed an alcohol factory. He made alternate fuels for the Taiwan Sugar Company and eventually became president of two sugar factories in Taiwan. He also worked to develop particle board from sugar cane residues.

He married while in college and had five children, two sons, and three girls, including twins. By the time he retired from the sugar business, his children were all living in the United States, so he and his wife moved here in 1987. His children consist of three physicists, one chemical engineer, and one computer designer. The girls all live in Palo Alto, one son lives in Los Angeles, and one in Dallas. Mou-chin lives with his daughter, Chinglu Lin, (a splendid translator!).

Mou-chin is now a US citizen, but often goes back to Taiwan. In 1988, he returned to his homeland of China and his birthplace, Nanking, for the first time since 1946. He still has many friends and relatives in Taiwan.

Mou-chin played bridge in Taiwan with very good players on teams from the sugar company. The standards were different, and no points were involved. In this country, he missed his bridge. Enterprisingly, he turned to the yellow pages, and there he found our bridge club. Getting partners was a little difficult at first, but by now many people are eager to play with him. He has about 900 points and likes to play in tournaments as well as in club games. After sitting at the bridge table, all his pains, he says, go away. His attitude is relaxed; he doesn't look for worries. He forgets a lot, he says, "but never the bridge schedule."

He has recently begun tutoring students in his home, in small classes, on a weekly basis. Two of his students have already come to the bridge club, winning a third place, and then a first!

Anonymous Note to the Kibitzer

During the STAC games last August, I watched several of the Swiss Team games. I found it surprising and somewhat disturbing that most players bid and played just as they do at the regular match point games. Playing at match points, your technique is to try to get a top on the board. In Swiss Teams at IMP scoring, there's no such thing as top on the board. There are three basic rules for IMP play.


If you are declarer, your objective is to make your contract. It is foolish to take any risk for an extra trick even when the odds are in your favor. If your contract is two hearts and you make it, you score 110. An extra trick gives you 140. The difference is only one IMP. But if you go down 50 points, your opponents get 160 (their 110 plus 50 for setting you), which is 4 IMPs. At game contracts, the difference is 11 IMPs and more if you are vulnerable.

From the first rule it follows that when you are a defender, any risk is justified if you can set the contract. If you give the opponents an extra trick because your play backfired, you give them only one IMP.

Matches are usually won on one big swing. This frequently happens because of a reluctance to let the opponents play in a low contract. Be wary when you come in with a balancing double or a fourth hand bid. These may be successful at matchpoints, but can be suicidal at IMPs. For example, your right hand opponent (RHO) deals and bids 1 spade, you pass. LHO bids 2 spades. There are two passes. You hold eleven points and 4 hearts. At match points, a double may be successful to push your opponents to the three level. At IMPs it is foolhardy to do anything but pass.
