The tournament starts on the evening of Wednesday, July 2, and continues through Sunday, July 6, at the Hyatt Regency Santa Clara hotel at 5101 Great America Parkway in Santa Clara. There will be games of interest to players of all skill levels and personal preference, including Open and Intermediate/Newcomer Pairs, Compact and Bracketed Knockouts and Swiss teams.

There are two special events scheduled for Thursday, July 3. At 11:00 a.m., Frank Smoot and Lori Spaeth will give a bridge lesson for Intermediate/ Newcomers on no-trump play. The second event features Unit



member and Grand Life Master Gene Simpson who will host a Question and Answer session at 12:15 p.m. If you have questions on any aspect of the game from bidding to declarer play to defense, ask Gene and you'll probably be glad you did. Preferably, write down your question and hand it to Gene at the beginning of the session.

The July calendar has two NAP qualification matches, both on Wednesdays. Bridge 'n Brunch will hold one on July 9 at 11 a.m. and the Doubleton Club on July 16 at 7 p.m. Players who place in the overalls in their respective strata earn sectionalrated half red and half black masterpoints. Any player who scores average or higher or finishes in the upper half will be eligible for the next qualification round.

Getting to know

Ina Frymire by Mary Van Tamelen

o you remember who won the men's collegiate basketball tournament? It probably didn't affect many in our bridge club, but here's a nonagenarian who really cares and is proud. Ina Frymire hails from Kansas.

She might still be there if her fiancé, who worked for International Harvester, had not transferred to California. Ina

was working throughout the depression because of the business skills she had learned at the business university in Wichita. But California! It was an exciting prospect, so they decided to get married—on two days' notice. The invitations went out by word of mouth but the occasion still managed to nearly fill the church.

It was a thrilling drive to California as newlyweds; gas was 22 cents a gallon, and California beckoned. However, it was not so thrilling when their destination proved to be the Imperial Valley, where temperatures soared to 120 degrees. Soon, however, they transferred to Stockton and then to one place after another in California (Ina stopped counting when it got to 21!) and then to London (for

During this peripatetic life, Ina managed to raise two sons— "great guys" she says who went on to produce for Ina four grandchildren and one great granddaughter. After her husband died in 1989, Ina moved to Menlo Park, where she still lives and avidly reads, knits,

cooks (especially desserts) and did volunteer work until a recent injury to her neck slowed her down a bit.

She began playing bridge "long ago, back when you played stupid bridge." Her only instruction came from a club in Indianapolis, where five minute lessons preceded the games. Her opponents today wouldn't believe it but she says she is "still waiting" to play "smart" bridge.

Ina hasn't lost her interest in active sports, but now watches them on television. Because she was a long-time golfer herself, she warns people not to disturb her during the Masters' golf tournament. And wasn't it obliging of the University of Kansas to produce the winning team?

1. Look at the spade suit. If partner has three small, you'll probably lose only one trick in the suit with the first hand, hence the answer is Hand #1.

2. Here, 2NT is not for the minors. It shows 20-21HCP.

3. Since there's no reason to preempt in fourth seat, this bid shows an opening hand with a good six-card suit. Ciao! Look for more in August.
