There are more than 800 sectional tournaments listed at the ACBL website for 2008. Only 19 are run over five days and only five of these are held west of the Mississippi. Our annual Firecracker Sectional is one of these rare gems. This all adds up to a lot of extra fun and interesting possibilities, so please take full advantage of it. Come early and play often at the Firecracker.

Firecracker '08 begins Wednesday, July 2 with a 7:00 p.m. session and continues through Sunday evening, July 6 at the Hyatt Regency Santa Clara hotel, 5101 Great America Parkway. The second day will have three sessions that start at 9:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.; the final three days have two sessions each at 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. The full schedule of events appears in this *Kibitzer* and is also at our Unit website. For those who wish to stay at the hotel there is a special rate of \$99 per night if you make your reservation by June 11; after that the rate may be available but is not guaranteed. NAP GAMES COMING SOON

The North American Pairs (NAP) start at the club level in June, July and August. A player may qualify many times and with as many different partners as desired. Watch the *Kibitzer* and the Unit web site for announcements of NAP games. Bridge 'n Bruch and Doubleton clubs have listed qualification games for July.

Players who place in the overalls earn sectionalrated half red and half black masterpoints. Any player, who scores average, or in the upper half in their respective strata, will be eligible to play in a two-session Unit final to fulfill the requirements for the District matches. The masterpoint strata are: A (Open), B (0-2000), C (0-500 Non-Life Masters).
