## MORE ABOUT TEAMS of TWO PAIRS

"Teams of Two Pairs" (see p. 1) is a locally invented, ACBL sanctioned team game conceived by our own Gersh Wheeler and played for the first time at our Unit in 1976.

In this game, each team gets two chances on every hand to earn the better score. Both pairs on a team play each hand in the same direction and only the better result counts. For example, one N/S pair bids 4 S and makes six for 480 , while the other pair also playing N/S bids the slam getting 980 . The N/S team scores 980 , the better of their two scores. Similarly, the E/W opposition team scores minus 480 , the better of their two scores.

There are two sections with duplicated boards. Each pair of a team sits in the same directional position in the two sections, and keeps a separate score as in a Mitchell pair game. Both pairs of every E/W team move, while both pairs of every N/S team are stationary. Both halves of each team play the same boards at the same time and the N/S scores are compared only to other N/S scores and E/W to other E/W scores as in a pairs tournament.

This type of game lends itself to some interesting and unusual tactics which are decided upon before the game and must be divulged to the opponents before play. Examples of tactics are:

- one pair can bid aggressively including bidding close games and slams, double freely for penalties, play light overalls and balance frequently. The conservative pair does not stretch, makes sound doubles, plays sound overcalls and balances infrequently.
- one pair can use strong opening no-trump bids while the other uses weak no-trump, or one pair can use transfers while the other does not so that the team always has any possible lead advantage.
- if there is a two-way finesse for a Q , one pair can elect to always play the Q in front of the J , while the other pair always plays the Q behind the J. Therefore, one of the pairs will always pick up the queen.

## It Seems to Me By Gersh Wheeler

In 1930 a hand appeared in a bridge column in our local newspaper that required a squeeze play to make the contract. The bridge columnist said he thought the play was too difficult to find "over the table" and in his opinion squeeze plays were figured out after much study in the postmortem. Now flash forward to the $21^{\text {st }}$ century. In local duplicates I make a squeeze play almost every session. What's more, the play doesn't give me a top on the board, which means other players found the squeeze too. Like most techniques in bridge, squeezes are not difficult, but do require some experience with them to recognize a situation as a possible squeeze.

There are many varieties of squeezes, but I would like to explain how to recognize simple squeezes. First you must be able to take all but one of the remaining tricks. Second, you must have two threats for the final trick. One of these threats must consist of the highest card in a suit and a small card. The other threat must be the second highest card of another suit. Third, one opponent must have to protect both threats.

Here is an example:

Your two threats are the 2 and the K . When you play the A, L.H.O. cannot protect both. If L.H.O. discards a high spade, you discard the $\vee \mathrm{K}$ from dummy and win two spade tricks, If L.H.O, discards the $\vee$ A, you discard a spade from dummy, and dummy wins the last two tricks.

Notice that if your opponent's hands were interchanged, the squeeze wouldn't work, because dummy would have to give up one of the threats before the opponent who is protecting them. But if the $\mathbf{V}$ were in your hand, either opponent would be squeezed. The situation would be:

Now if either opponent held both suits protected, he would be squeezed when you play the A.

A slight variation also works against both opponents: DUMMY

When you play the A, L.H.O. must keep the A, so discards a spade. Now dummy discards the $\downarrow$ K. R.H.O. is squeezed since a spade discard lets you make 2 spade tricks, and a discard of the A lets you make the trick.

Some years ago my wife and I were playing in a regional tournament. After complicated bidding I was declarer at 6 NT. My L.H.O. was Lou Mathe, one of the great international players. Mathe led a small \&. Dummy had AK alone, so I won the opening lead in dummy and considered my prospects. I could count 11 top tricks and realized I needed a squeeze for the $12^{\text {th }}$. But for the squeeze to be successful I had to be able to win all but one trick. Thus, I had to lose a trick first. So I led a small $\varphi$ from dummy and played another small one from my hand. Mathe won the trick and conceded the slam. He knew that I lost the trick to "rectify the count" and he also knew that he would be squeezed since he held the two guard cards.
