Play of the Hand Subject of November Lectures

For example with the holding: AQ10 8 opposite xxx, the correct play depends on the number tricks required i.e. 4 or 3 or 2. The lectures will not emphasize a large number of combinations to look up or memorize, but there will be some references given for those who want to explore further. It Seems To Me By Gersh

NEXT BOARD MEETING: Tuesday, November 4th at 3:45 p.m. Your left-hand opponent is dealer and bids 1 ♥. Your partner hesitates for a few seconds and then passes. Your RHO passes. You hold about thirteen high-card points and a stopper in hearts. On your convention card a 1 NT overcall in the balancing positions is indicated as showing 11-14 HCP. What do you do? I have asked this question of about twenty players and was surprised at the variability in answers. At one extreme was Eva Herrmann who said she would pass whenever her partner had made a slow pass. At the other extreme were a few players who said they would ignore partner's hesitation and bid just as if there were no hesitation. Other replies were that a response might be based on who the opponents were or on how our game was going.

My own feeling is that I agree with Eva. To bid 1 NT here is probably good match-point procedure, but it might turn out to be a disaster. However, after your partner's hesitation, the NT bid has a better than even chance of being successful. This knowledge is the result of unauthorized information. Your opponents may even think that you based your call on the hesitation. This is unpleasant even though no one says so.

Hesitations always cause problems, even when they are followed by bids. Now you know your partner's bid is limited. You should make every effort to avoid hesitating. The best way is to look at your hand and decide beforehand what you will do over any bid. This is sometimes difficult but not impossible.

There is one situation where the hesitation does not convey unauthorized information. That is when the pass is forcing. Consider this situation:

East was willing to play at 2, but he bid 3 over his opponent's 3. He could have let the opponents play at 3. By bidding he may drive them to a makeable 4 contract. Therefore, his 3 bid says that if the opponents bid game, he is prepared to punish them. His pass over 4 is an order to partner to double or to bid 4. If he hesitates before passing, the pass is still forcing.

Common Director Decisions And Helpful Information for New Duplicate Bridge Players

Would you like a refresher course on reading the recap sheet or scoring? Some of the handouts are now available on line. Remember, the players don't need to know all the laws. When something goes wrong at the table, **call the director!**

- "We Can't All Sit East-West!" Someone must keep score. Learn how to fill out a traveler or a pick-up slip.
- "Matchpoint Theory 101". Learn what all those numbers and marks on the recap sheet mean.
- "That's Insufficient". Your RHO made an insufficient bid. What should you do? Call the director, of course.
- "Opening Call Out of Turn What Now?"
- "Lead Out of Turn What Now?"
- "It's a Penalty Card Or Is It?" Do you know your options when a penalty card is on the table?
- "Oops! I Want a Do-Over!". You messed up and called the wrong card from dummy, pulled out the wrong bid card, or played the wrong card out of your hand. What now?
- "My Partner Didn't Alert What Now?". Your partner forgot to alert a bid. What should you do?
- "Oops! I Forgot!". You forgot your partnership was playing a new convention and you used the old bid. What are your ethical obligations?
