It Seems To Me By Gersh

Many years ago I wrote a column for the *Kibitzer* to show that it is better to have a solid side suit than a solid trump suit. My example was as follows:

<u>North</u>	<u>South</u>
S AKQJT	S 532
H A9864	H 532
D 2	D 7654
C 53	C AK6

I showed that North as declarer can make 4H, but cannot make 4S, after trumping diamonds whenever the opponents win a trick.

Now on January 29, 2009 Eric Mayefsky is giving a lecture on bids that show two suits. The problem

is which suit do you bid, when you have three cards in each of them. For example: Opener on your left bids 1D and your partner bids 2D. This is a Michaels' bid to show both majors. You hold S KJ2, H 876, D 43, C K8675. Remember that it is better to have a solid side suit. So you should bid 2H. The spade honors may make the spade suit solid.

Obviously, if your choice is between a major and a minor you will bid the major. But, if your choice is between two majors or two minors, bid the suit that doesn't have honors.

If you hold four cards in one suit and three in the other, bid the four-card suit. But prefer a threecard major to a four-card minor.
