However we now find we are unable to meet current expenses and to plan for future expenses without additional income. Accordingly, beginning July 1, owners will raise table fees for all games at the Bridge Center. Owners will make their own new fee announcements.

It Seems to Me

You open the bidding one in a suit. Your opponent doubles. Your partner bids one in a higher ranking suit. This should be played as a one-round force and may be of unlimited strength. Note that if partner bids two or more in a suit over the double, it should be preemptive. A bid of two no trump by partner usually indicates a limit raise or better.


My partner opened one heart. Next player doubled. I held a singleton spade, four hearts, and 13 HCP. I assumed we could make game in hearts, but I feared the opponents could sacrifice at four spades, so I bid one spade! After my partner's rebid, I bid four hearts.

If this sequence comes up when your partner is the doubler, I would suggest that a double of the one spade bid says "that's my suit" and shows at least six HCP. It does not have to be alerted, but should be explained if opponents ask its meaning.
