

A bridge game is a unique slice of life. Each hand and each set of opponents present new challenges. And dedicated bridge players strive to conquer those challenges and win the games in which they compete.

Eight or so years ago I had the incredibly good fortune to attend a duplicate bridge game without a partner. The director, a man known for accommodating partner-less players, introduced me to the woman who became my closest friend. I will be forever grateful for that serendipitous meeting.

Since then, through our experiences together, my partner and I learned much about the game of bridge. We learned to pay close attention to each card the other played and to follow her signals rather than second-guessing her strategies. We learned to forget about being right and to support each other's insights about defense and tactics in bidding. We were becoming skilled at the intricate dance of discerning the best contract, even when the cards we were each dealt didn't appear to fit together.

As declarer, I used to take the lead as soon as possible, pull trump, and only then would I begin to set up tricks in side suits. I wondered why she often chose a different line of play, intentionally ducking the early tricks in order to set up future ones. I came to realize that by careful negotiation at the beginning of the hand, she avoided the precarious situation where unanticipated distribution or an opponent's hold-up play near the end of the hand might change the outcome. My partner taught me patience.

While meticulously reviewing the hands we played, we together discovered bidding and defensive sequences that would have landed us in the best contract or created the perfect defense. But doing it right was never the ultimate goal. Doing it together, smoothly communicating and thoughtfully considering each move – why did she choose to lead a suit other than the one she bid? Why didn't she play the lowest card she held in the suit I led? – made our game flourish.

Because bridge is not about winning a game. It's about partnership.

We listened to each other's triumphs and worries and gave encouragement, honest feedback and wholehearted support. Our communications have truly changed my life and I appreciate the gift of her partnership in more ways than I can possibly express in this brief tribute. My bridge partner is an extraordinary person.

This is for you, Donna. Thank you.


A tribute to Sioux's bridge partner, Donna Armstrong, who passed away last month.
