

They say there aren't enough young people involved in bridge these days, but

our Unit is especially lucky! We have among us a young player—one who's very interested, very involved, and exceedingly good at the game. Eric Mayefsky is *so good* that in 2008 he represented the United States in the World Championships for University students in Poland and in Beijing at the World Championship for players under the age of 26. (The US teams took fifth in both events.)

He's so *involved* in bridge that he's a director; he has run a Thursday night game at Stanford. Furthermore, he often teaches a bridge class at Stanford, a student-initiated class under the auspices of the Symbolic Systems Program, sponsored by a computer science professor. Students use Learn to Play Bridge as a textbook, have homework, earn one unit of credit and get graded. Unfortunately, according to Eric, not enough of them get hooked on the game—it's not social enough, not relaxing enough and it faces all the competition of video games. He really is sorry that more don't go on

to duplicate—"It's so cool, and there's so much to it."

In his spare time he's an active member of our Unit's Board!

Eric, born in New York City and raised in Westchester, got interested in the game at age 13 when his great-aunt taught him to play in Florida. She took him to his first duplicate game, where he had no idea of how to play and ended up with only one good board. But he began playing online with her, studied The Fun Way to Serious Bridge, taught his friends to play, joined the ACBL in high school and by his freshman year in college won the college championship. He attended Stanford for his undergraduate degree and stayed there for his PhD in Economics; he's in his third year of grad school.

He's working hard at getting better, always learning more. He appreciates practicing against opponents who "know what they are doing," and likes focusing, playing seven days in a row, counting and using creative bidding and good judgment.

Eric epitomizes just what the game of bridge needs: youth, interest, involvement, and talent. It's such a shame—or maybe not—to share him with the field of economics—which needs him even more.
