Sherie Announces a Transfer

By March 31 Sherie Greenberg will pass on ownership of Sherie's BC, which meets on Thursday at 11 a.m. at the new Jewish Community Center, to Life Master John Schwartz. Sherie owned or coowned several games beginning in the 1980's. Her Monday Palo Alto BC played at a variety of locations; her Wednesday Bridge 'n Brunch game was sold to Sue Johnston; and of course her Thursday game which she originally owned with Kathy Jacobs and which was held for a while at the JCC on Arastradero. In 2001 Sherie became its sole owner when Kathy left the area.

Bridge Center Rehab — On February 12, (ironically the anniversary of the great deluge) two contractors retained by Twisters' Insurance Co. met with the Unit Executive Committee and with the owner of Twisters. This meeting was necessary prior to the contractors' submission of bids for doing the required rehab work outlined in the report of the remediation consultant. Both contractors had a number of questions before they could prepare a full scope of work and price. We do not know whether their questions have been answered. We expect the scope of work will only include our Bridge Center space.

Since we have only 18 months left on our sub-lease with Twisters, we are exploring other properties, including the space next door. We are collecting information regarding anticipated costs and will report to the Board and the Membership, as we proceed.

Show and Tell - The Bridge Center has purchased an Epson EX51 projector and a pull-down screen to be mounted near the ceiling. These will facilitate presentations for the lecturers and education classes.

April Lectures - Play better bridge! April 8 – Improve Your Game by not just Playing Club Games by Geeske Joel and April 22 – Cue Bids by Hamish Bennett.

Big Game- Fung Bao and Sioux Atkinson had a 72% game on February 25.

Challenge - The first Swiss Teams date for this Peninsula Challenge Swiss Teams event which features San Mateo Unit players vs. those from Palo Alto is set for Saturday, April 24, at the Bayshore Bridge Club. There is still time to sign-up to represent our Unit in one of three strata: five A teams (1500+), five B teams (300-1500), five C teams (0-300). Strata are calculated based on average point of team members. Look for details and sign-up opportunities at the Bridge Center. It Seems To Me

Don't talk too much at the bridge table, as you might give your opponents information. Here are some examples.

- 1. My left-hand opponent was dealer and bid 1NT. This was before the alert procedure. My wife looked at his convention card and saw 12-14 for the bid and she bid 2D. Next player passed. I bid 3C. Dealer asked what my partner's 2D bid meant. We were playing better minor for take-out over weak notrump. So I replied, "She has support for spades, hearts and diamonds." My opponent's questioner enabled me to tell my partner that I remembered our convention. He should have just passed and given us a chance to make a mistake.
- 2. My partner opened 1C, I bid 1S and the next player bid 2D. Partner doubled. The next opponent asked if that was a support double. I said it was. But I had forgotten this. If my opponent had kept quiet, we would have gone wrong.
- 3. An opponent opened 1NT. The partner then bid 4H. Was this a transfer? I didn't ask. My opponents had it wrong and ended in 5H, down one.

100,000 Boards -- It's a Big Deal by Sioux Atkinson

What bridge player doesn't appreciate having the hands already dealt before her or his arrival at the club and getting printed-out hand records after the game? I certainly do. And part of what makes that possible is our unit's card dealing machine, the Play-BridgeDealer4. This February, Unit 503 reached a milestone: our PlayBridgeDealer4 dealt its 100,000th board, earning us the record of the most boards dealt by a club in the USA -- and in only 2-1/2 years of use! Our machine was purchased in August of 2007, thanks to the foresight of Alan Cummings and our Unit 503 board members.

Terry Collier, our PlayBridgeDealer4 rep, wrote to Alan saying, "I am pleased to hear that you have reached such a milestone and I feel confident in saying that you must have the highest count in the USA. Your machine was ... one of the first three to be supplied, the other two clubs being the Naples Club [in Naples, Florida] and Bridge Spot [in Woburn, Massachusetts]. We now have over 250 machines in use in the USA in addition and a similar number in other parts of the world, including China, Australia, New Zealand, France, Germany, Greece, Holland, Spain, Israel, Canada and the UK.

"You may be interested in knowing that we dealt the cards for the World Mind Sports Games in Beijing in Oc-

tober 2008, dealing a similar number of boards to your total but in just 10 days, admittedly we used 4 [of] our machines and a team of 10 people to achieve this and unlike you dealt directly into boards rather than the manual transfer system that you use.Most clubs will only deal around 20,000 boards per year - so you have more than exceeded the average - again well done."

Terry also related information about an upcoming service, "Hands Around the World," which would allow challenges to be played between clubs in various countries, using hands dealt by the Play-BridgeDealer4 machines.

The other day I got to watch our machine in action. It's quite impressive -- dealing a board in about 6.5 seconds with the capability of dealing about 100 boards an hour. The random hands for a game are created and analyzed (in order to generate and print hand records) by the software, DealmasterPro, on our computer. The hands subsequently are "read" into the dealing machine. The Play-BridgeDealer4 has an optical card recognition system, employing a video camera, which avoids the need for using specially marked cards. In groups of three, decks of unsorted cards can be loaded into the machine which, when the start button is pressed, will deal the cards, one deck at a time, into a special platform with slots for North, East, West,

and South hands. The person running the machine then transfers the four hands into a board, while the machine waits, ready to deal the next hand.

The magical dealer needs occasional maintenance, and Will, our maintenance guru, is on the spot to takes care of whatever is necessary. Here's a photo to document the event: Director Will Watson and the PlayBridgeDealer4 dealing the 100,000th hand!
