Constitution Amendment Vote Postponed to August 29	At the Unit Game on Sunday August 29, the Unit will hold a special meet- ing to make revisions to the Constitution. And Bylaws. The Unit requests that the Unit members present vote to <i>accept</i> the proposed changes. The purpose of these revisions is to simplify the Treasurer's job which currently necessitates maintenance of two bank accounts, one for the Unit and one for the Bridge Center and which requires writing checks to transfer funds in and out of each bank account. The proposed changes would eliminate one account but the Treasurer would keep separate books, one set for Unit in- come and expenses and the other for Bridge Center income and ex- penses. The change may also offer opportunities for higher interest income. Please see Unit website and Bridge Center bulletin board for specific revisions.
New Monday Club to Open July 26	The new Monday Morn JCC game at 11 a.m. will have a section limited to players with fewer than 50 MP's, another limited to players with fewer than 200 or 300 MP's and an open section. The location is the Oshman Family Jewish Community Center, in the Cultural Arts Hall, 3921 Fabian Way, Palo Alto . The driving and parking directions are on the Unit 503 web site. As at the Thursday game at the JCC, there will be free snacks, and play- ers may order lunch from the café on the premises either when they arrive or in advance.
STAC Up the Silver at both Pairs and Swiss	Gather up a hoard of silver points at STAC XIX the week of August 16-22 at both pairs and Swiss events. As with other STACs, the pair overalls will be computed across all participating clubs. Stratification for the open games is A=2000+, B=750-2000 and C=0-750. Awards are silver, sectional-rated points. There will be Swiss team STACs at: Alpine BC, Tuesday, August 17, Bridge 'n Brunch Wednesday, August 18 and Friday Night Barometer, Au- gust 20. The other clubs will all hold pairs games. Because the Unity Church is not available on Tuesday, August 17 or Wednesday, August 18, there will be no STAC's at this location. Rothschild Gets a Fast Start	Each year the Unit presents an award to the member who accumulates the most points in the Unit games, including the Sunday specials and the Mon- day night Swiss. The list shows that Don Rothschild has gotten off to a big lead with Polly Siegel also well ahead among the Non-Life Masters. The point totals are: Don Rothschild-11.34, Tahir Gokcen-8.99, Franklin Gon- zalez-8.54, Henryk Szejnwald-8.54, Sherie Greenberg-8.26, Jean Flocks-6.6, Chris Lazarovici-6.6, Betsy Steele-6.51, Carol Brigham-6.5, Alex Lovejoy- 5.87. Among the Non-Life Masters with fewer than 300 MP, Polly Siegel has 7.16 points followed by Robert Bergey with 4.69.

Membership Growth - The July ACBL report shows that the Unit membership is over 888, an 8% increase over the total of last year at this time.

Firecracker Trivia - For a sparkling Firecracker, have a chair named Steve for the last two years! There were 1088 players versus 1144 last year, down 5%, 333 were Unit members (the same number as in 2009) including 141 who were 199ers. Christian Lazarovici with 25.34 points was the Unit member earning the most points with Chris Chung the NLM with the most points. The players included some from as far away as Las Vegas, Arizona and Florida. Coming back from Missouri, to celebrate the fourth with us were Unit members Tom and Nancy Cadwell. But how often does the Firecracker have a player come from the Netherlands to play?

Firecracker Burned Brightly

A whopping success! The Unit has done it again! With 1040 tables, the total was 99% of last year's record. Congratulations to every one of the Unit members who helped make this possible, especially Tournament Chair, Steve Barasch, his committee chairs and their teams and to the many, many members who played and assisted at the event. The Unit also appreciated the dedicated work of the Tournament Director, Nancy Boyd, and all the other ACBL directors who kept the games running smoothly. Saturday was the biggest day with 246 tables and-Monday the second highest with 216 ½. The table summary for all the sessions was: Thurs: first 105, second 80; Fri: 116 & 87; Sat: 125 &121; Sun: 99.5 & 90; Mon: 113 &103.5. The open pairs table count was 344, 199er pairs 138, KO 249 and Swiss 309.

The large participation made it possible for the Unit to earn an estimated net income of \$3,432 based on table fees of \$41,560.
