Membership Meeting Planned for March 28

The San Mateo and Palo Alto Units have organized a Swiss Teams Event between the two Units. The first match will be at the Bayshore Bridge Club on Saturday, April 24 with a second one to follow in September in Palo Alto. Each contest will consist of four matches, six boards a match, with 15 teams participating from each Unit based on average masterpoints of team members. There will be five A teams (1500+), five B teams (300-1500) and five C teams (0-300). The cost is \$12 per person. Teams will only play against teams from the other unit, and the unit with the highest combined score after both games will win. Individual teams will also win masterpoints as usual. Bridging the Gap from Easy Bridge to Open Games by Carolyn Chaney

Our Unit has excellent beginning and intermediate lessons, a fine mentor-mentee program, and a number of games to help newcomers join the fascinating world of duplicate bridge. The Unit has made a great effort to be welcoming to newcomers through games such as Just for Fun, Friday morning EZ Bridge and the Wednesday afternoon and evening 49er games. But I have noticed that not many players make the jump into the open games, and I can attest that it can be painful (albeit educational) to play in games where I am one of the few 199ers.

So this article (and hopefully a few more) is devoted to finding ways to provide transition from the beginner games to open games. What can we do to be welcoming to and supportive of the newer players? I plan to tell you a few of my own stories and pass along suggestions made by others.

First, we can interrupt our analysis of the last hand to welcome and greet the East/West players arriving at our table. This simple courtesy is so rare, that when players do it at tournaments, we exclaim, "Oh you must know Walter," referring to Walter Miller's practice of encouraging greeting each East/West player. Happy Name Tag Day is also very welcoming. I hear experienced players say, "Everyone knows me," and they don't realize that newer players not only don't know them, but that name tags reduce the intimidation factor by allowing us to greet each other by name, as friends. Phyllis Gaffney has done a great service

by ordering a special name tag for anyone who wants one, and she continues to provide this service for the cost of the magnetic pin, plus postage. So let's put on our name tags for those who don't know us.

As a relative newbie, there are some tables I approach with happy expectation and others I approach with something akin to dread. What makes the difference? I love to come to tables where I can ask a more experienced player a question at the end of the round, such as "What would you have lead?" Or, "Would you have bid the four clubs first or the four diamonds?" It can also be helpful when one of our expert players offers a suggestion in a supportive way. I have learned a lot from the generosity of expert players in our club! So what causes dread? Unsolicited criticism. "You shouldn't ask what that bid meant." "If you hadn't led that spade, you could have set our contract." One player actually complained to the director when my partner disagreed with the "expert's" unsolicited advice. There's a fine line between making a helpful suggestion and providing criticism, but if we regard welcoming the newer players as the responsibility of all of us, then we can make our open games a great learning experience for all.
