We must bid a fond farewell to a woman who was the heart of the Palo Alto Bridge Unit for over 50 years. She was the "Good Will Ambassador" to all new members. She greeted everyone and offered to partner them if they had no one else with whom to play.

Lorna played bridge seven days a week, with almost a perfect attendance record. Her wonderful sense of humor was aided by her mischievous twinkle, quick wit, smile, and laugh. She was a big flirt and made eyes at all the men, in innocent fun. She

cared about people and how they were doing. When chided for her questioning, she would retort, "I'm writing a book".

Lorna could always be counted on to do anything for the club. She was chairman of Hospitality and Caddies at the sectional for many years. She was the Sunshine chairman of the Unit, sending messages in times of happiness and sadness. The Unit recognized her contributions by honoring her



with the Unit Sportsmanship Award. She also received the District 21 Goodwill Award and was a finalist in the national Goodwill awards.

Lorna was a proud Nebraskan who lived in many places in the U S and Europe. She studied education at Cadron State and business at Columbia. She was a teacher in a one room schoolhouse, a sergeant in the US Army, a pilot, a charity worker and a mother. She raised

three children with her husband Louie Corbetta. Being a mother and grandmother was probably her primary job.

She will be sadly missed by all who knew her and loved her. She is probably speaking to the higher powers right now, organizing a bridge game in her new abode and working on St. Peter to be her partner.

"Encouraging, supportive."
Those are words best describing what a bridge teacher should be. And those are the words most often used to describe Carla Davis, an energetic bridge teacher. She has taught many people—she figures about 10%

of the members in our Unit. And she has taught in many places, beginning at the big Co-op formerly on San Antonio Road, and including at the YWCA, the Elks Club, the Menlo Park and the Los Altos Recreation Centers, the Menlo and Los Altos Country Clubs, St. Simon's Church, the JCC, as well as in people's homes.

Carla began Easy Bridge on Fridays at our Bridge Center, starting with three or four tables and growing within two years to ten tables. Beginning with a 20 minute lesson, these sessions were designed to introduce low-level players to duplicate, and give people a "chance to learn to play well." From that beginning, EZ Bridge, she says, "now needs four people to replace me."

Born in Berlin, Carla moved with her family to San Francisco when she was three. She went to

Lowell High School, and then to business school in order to get a job. She worked in insurance offices for several years.

In high school her homeroom teacher started a bridge club and she and her tennis friend, Jim Davis, learned to play. She learned duplicate before rubber bridge, mastering each system—Culbertson, Goren point count, then 5-card majors, then Precision and now 2/1 Game Force—as they came along. "Jim was a marvelous bridge player and teacher as well," she relates. They had "bridge games instead of dates." Those "dates" led to marriage and four children, two girls and then two boys, one of whom became a Life Master at 16.

The marriage lasted 35 years. Jim died at the bridge table while playing in a Swiss Team event at a San Mateo Regional in 1977.

Tennis has been Carla's hobby since she was 13. Nowadays, she likes to read—mostly novels—and go to the theatre and take classes. But most of her pleasure comes from teaching bridge: "I'm so satisfied when my students do well," she says.

Her teacher's advice? "Do the best you can and don't give up. Enjoy the game and keep improving." That's Carla—encouraging, supportive.
