
Valerie Baldwin


David Crosley

If I were to describe her with just one word, that word would be "Lady", using the traditional meaning of the word. She loved decorating her house sometimes with tapestries she had made herself, decorating the Bridge Center especially at Christmas, shopping (I won't tell you how many jackets she had or how she loved chocolate and always kept chocolate or candy in her purse).

Mary Ann was a helper. She helped her husband Jerry run Jerry's Liquors and Deli in Los Altos for many years. She helped with anything that needed doing at the Bridge Center, including scrubbing tables and chairs and cabinets, arriving early and staying late to help with setup and cleanup. Her son made the tray that the coffee pot sits in. She had new flooring put into the Center kitchen, paying for it herself.

Probably shopping (jewelry, antique glassware, chocolate) was her favorite pastime, but bridge came a close second. She played five or more days/week. She and I played together frequently and attended tournaments, which with her were always great fun. She often told a story about being totally embarrassed when a neighbor came over as she was leaving for bridge one day and asked her where she worked. Mary Ann said, "I had to tell her I didn't work I was going to play bridge." And the neighbor said, "Every day??" Of course if you are not a bridge player, you would never understand, right

Mary Ann and Jerry have three children, two girls and a boy and eight grandchildren, two boys and six girls, all of whom were a great joy to Mary Ann. She was expecting her first great grandchild any day.

Goodbye to you, dear friend. We all miss your good humor, your terrific attitude, your friendship and your bridge skills.
