

PROFILE OF GEESKE JOEL BY MARY VAN TAMELEN



After an exciting, come-from-behind match (overcoming a 62-point deficit) last May in Detroit, Geeske Joel's team won! As a result, they just represented the United States—and by extension, our Unit and women—in the World Championships held last month in the Netherlands. Members of her

team included Jill Myers, Jill Levin, Debbie Rosenberg, Tobi Sokolow, Janice Molson and coach Eric Kokish.

Geeske hasn't been playing bridge very long only since 2004. While in school in Wankendorf, a small town in northern Germany, her game was chess in spite of a math teacher who urged her to play bridge instead. Then for many years she was involved in studies, both in the United States and in Germany. At the age of 16 she was an exchange student in Colorado; back in college in Germany she studied earth system sciences. In 1990 she earned a Master's degree at Stanford, worked at Carnegie Institute for one-and-a-half years, then went back to Germany to finish her diploma, later earning her PhD at Stanford in biological sciences in 2000. Between her studies, she married, in 1995, Urs, a Swiss born computer expert she met at Stanford who is wonderfully supportive of all her activities.

With a new PhD in this country, she didn't have a work permit. Besides, she said, "Work is overrated."

Pursuing an interest in dogs, she became involved in the Leonberger league. Leonbergers are relatively rare, large, long-haired, floppy-eared family dogs. You may have worked your way

around Geeske's pet, Yoshka, as you entered the bridge club. That dog has since died; his daughter, Yenta, is five years old, and Geeske says the she is about ready to come to the club and wait patiently for her mistress. Geeske has trained Leonberger puppies, bred them, shown them, and studied their health.

Geeske has another impressive career in photography.

After all those years of being distracted by studies and dogs and pictures, she was finally ready to follow her math teacher's advice and learn to play bridge. She played in a small group at Google, then found the Palo Alto bridge website, read "Bridge for Dummies," and Walter's booklet which Geeske says was a simple start "that gave me a framework."

In an attempt "to get better faster," she worked with Michael Rosenberg on the internet; he designed a system for her before the SF Nationals. For that tournament she hired her first team and played with his wife Debbie. The team Geeske hired for the Nationals in Las Vegas came in second twice in the board-a-match; her team won the Women's Swiss in Louisville last spring. The same team also came in 4th at the two-day Open Swiss in New Orleans.

Geeske says she'll never become a world class player—she didn't start playing until her early 40s—but her aim is "to become as good as I can as quickly as I can." She doesn't play for points, but to "maximize her learning curve." She says it's difficult to measure yourself; you need to rely on your partner to tell you where you need work. Her "absolute favorite local partner" is Will Watson.

Geeske says her bridge career has had many ups and downs and she says there's still a "huge amount of room to improve." She wrote an article
