Plans for a New Bridge Center

The Building Committee of Alan C, Alan T and Mike A gave a report to the Board. The Board authorized the Committee to finalize the lease terms with certain provisions and then empowered the President to sign the lease. Also, the BOD allowed the Committee to take all necessary steps to complete the permit process with the City of Mountain View, including retention of Krone Design Inc, to complete the required architectural plans. Further, the BOD approved the hiring of contractors to build the tenant improvements required for our occupancy. The Committee has made tentative cost projections with the help of Krone Design and will keep the Board informed as more information is received.

Introducing a New Mentoring Experience

Valerie Baldwin has announced a mentoring program called "Play for Fun and Learn" to be held on two Saturdays a month beginning on March 12 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. It will start with a half hour lecture on one of Barbara Seagram's "25 Conventions You Should Know." After the presentation, participants will gather in tables of four mentees and one mentor. The players bid and play eight preset hands. Next, the mentor along with a script edited by an expert bridge player, reviews the bids, play of the hand and defense. Participants should have fewer than 150 masterpoints and will need to make a reservation by sending an email to Unit503mentor@gmail.com. The message should include the number of your masterpoints and name(s) of anyone with whom you would like to sit. Forty-two different addresses. That's how many our member and the EZ Game co-director, Margot Livenspargar, has had. When you're the daughter of an Army Brigadier General and then the wife of an Air Force pilot, that's what happens. You live in Wisconsin, Benicia, Miami, Germany, Okinawa and Apple Valley, to name a few places. Finally, visiting an old high school teacher, you hit upon Sunnyvale; you find good bridge, good medical care, a hairdresser, and a dentist—and here you've been for 3 1/2 years.

Margot graduated from Kubasaki High School in Okinawa, and before she went off to college, her father insisted she learn bridge—as well as typing and stenography—and he had his secretary teach her. Then she attended Northwestern University, where the Air Force pilot "swept me off my feet."

They kept up the peripatetic life style through the 42 years of their marriage and the raising of a son and daughter; her son graduated from the same high school she graduated from in Okinawa. The family ended up living in Apple Valley, where they opened an irrigation supply store. She became its office manager and accountant, and then ran it on her own for a year and a half after her husband died—"just to prove I could."

Back in 1977, she went to a computer show, saw her first computer, said, "I want one," and had it working for her store within six months. And she's been addicted to high technology ever since. She streams Netflix, keeps fit with Wii, and "just loves techy things."

Her father's secretary must have been a very good bridge teacher; Margot's been a director for 35 years. She began directing in Okinawa while living there for the third time, and kept it up in Apple Valley to ensure good bridge. And here she's working with Marolyn Imaoke-Yancey, Missy Verson and John Williams on Fridays—with a "very happy group" of EZBridge players, keeping it friendly. "People are so interesting," she says, "when you get beyond bridge." Her pet peeve, and a very small one it is, is players writing down the contract before leading.

We'll behave, and treat her very nicely—because we don't want her moving to her forty-third address!
