

#### TAKING OFF FOR THE FIRECRACKER

The Firecracker sectional is coming very soon. By now you are all aware that the dates have changed. Since the Convention Center is not available over the July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend, this year's tournament dates are Wednesday July 13 to Sunday July 17. Conveniently located the same as last year, the Firecracker will be at the Santa Clara Convention Center and in the same rooms. All Unit members are encouraged to attend, especially all the new members. For the past few years the Firecracker has been running with 1000 tables over the course of the five days, making it one of the largest sectionals in the United States. Let's continue this record for this year.

In order to give our beginning bridge players the opportunity to feel comfortable at a sectional tournament, there will be 49er pairs games at every session. Open pairs games and 199er games will occur every session, as well as Compact KO's every day but Sunday, when a two session Swiss

game is scheduled.

The Wednesday and Thursday games will be at 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. to accommodate people who are working. The games on Friday, Saturday and Sunday will be at 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. with a no-host buffet available for lunch. A complete schedule is printed in this issue of the *Kibitzer*, in an ad in the *Contract Bridge Forum*, on the Unit web site and on posters at all the Unit games.

The Firecracker still needs Caddies on Wednesday, July 13, afternoon and evening and on Thursday, July 14, evening. # RECENT UNIT GAME RESULTS



## MENTOR/MENTEE PROGRAM

As most of you know, our Unit has an on-going Mentor/Mentee program, different from the highly successful Mentee Lesson classes which Valerie Baldwin has been offering and which will soon recess for the summer.

What you may not know is how the Mentor/ Mentee program works and who is eligible for it. The Unit wants the Mentor/Mentee pairings to be relatively long term, i.e., more than a year, and to be fun and advantageous for both the mentor and the mentee. Our guidelines suggest that mentees have at least 50 masterpoints plus the equivalent of one year of lessons. The mentor will be either a Life Master or its equivalent. Directors can help us modify these guidelines in individual situations.

The mentor's job is not to teach the rules of bridge, but rather to help in the practice of the rules learned. Each mentor is asked to play at least once a month with his/her mentee and to be willing to spend time after the game reviewing the hands played. Pairs are encouraged to play more frequently, but once a month is the minimum.

We currently have a waiting list of newer players who are looking for mentors, but we need mentors to pair them with. If you are interested in being a mentor or a mentee, please contact either Kathie Shaw (bandkshaw@aol.com) or Merle Orelove (Merleor@comcast.net) to place your name on our list. We will do our best to find a good pairing for you. Since we do not know each of you personally, we ask that you let us know any time the pairing we make is not working. We want this program to be a very positive experience for everyone involved.

There will be a Unit Mentor/Mentee game later in the year. Watch the Kibitzer for announcement of date and time.

At the moment our new Stierlin Road home is not much more than a shell, so we are currently working with the landlord, IFES, on build-out, i.e., putting the facility into move-in condition. Duane Coleman is coordinating the project. IFES has just signed a contract with the contractor and they hope to start work next week and to finish for move in on Sept. 6 after the Santa Clara Regional.

In the meantime, we must secure the approval of the City of Mt View for a Conditional Use Permit. The hearing before the Zoning Administrator is scheduled for June 22nd. Before then, however, our representatives will meet with many of the neighbors concerned by the impact of the Bridge Club and additional cars which we will generate. On average about 50 people attend each lecture and over 300 people have attended one or more lectures (many have attended nearly all of them). Our lectures are free for both Unit members and non-members thanks to our Education Fund.


None of this would have happened without the vision and hard work of Alan Cummings. Alan created the program and has coordinated all aspects of it since its inception, including selecting lecturers and topics, providing hardcopies of notes at the lectures, providing the material to our

Prior to establishing the lecture series Alan had worked with the ACBL for two years to convince them to allow our Unit to have a tax-exempt fund for education programs like the series - the first, and maybe the only one of its kind in the ACBL. He then raised more than the \$15,000 in donations to establish the fund.
