From Highway 101:

Take the Shoreline Blvd Exit.

Turn onto Shoreline Blvd toward Mountain View.

Turn LEFT at the <u>light</u> onto Stierlin Road.

The Bridge Center will be on your right.

From Northbound Highway 85:

Take the Moffett Blvd exit. Turn LEFT onto Moffett Blvd. Turn RIGHT at the light onto Central Ave. Turn RIGHT at the stop sign onto Stierlin Road. The Bridge Center will be on your left.

From Central Expressway:

Turn onto Shoreline Blvd North Turn RIGHT at the light onto Stierlin Road. The Bridge Center will be on your right.

BRIDGE BITS AND PIECES

OK to Move In? —On October 12 the Mountain View Zoning Administrator issued a Temporary Use Permit to the Bridge Center, subject to becoming permanent when the final conditions are formulated. The majority of the conditions are applicable to IFES and concern noise control, parking, security, etc. Our temporary permit takes effect immediately, and we hope we can arrange to start games in the main IFES Hall (which is not the building we lease) until such time as our own building is complete. We will have use of this large facility only when no other event is scheduled. Much still remains to be worked out with respect to the schedule, so there will be some games at the JCC, and possibly the Unity Church. We are hopeful that we can occupy our permanent facility in late November or more probably, sometime in December.

UPGRADE YOUR BRIDGE BY FRED SCHWERER

At the Lecture Series Year IV Opener, Hamish Bennett discussed a variety of bidding considerations, including: when to by-pass a four-card major in opening a weak-two or as opener rebidding at the one level; exposing psych bids; and balancing over opponents' 1NT. For the latter, when the balancer is also a passed hand, Hamish introduced the use of Bennett, a simple method with some similarities to Hamilton and DONT. The trigger for using *Bennett* is distribution which Hamish defines as having a singleton or void. If you have either in this bidding sequence, balancing is mandatory. Hamish says that in his experience, situations for using Bennett arise in 3 out of 5 club games and he has never had a bad result using it. (NOTE: Mel Colchamiro advocates balancing over opponents 1NT with two shortness points, but doesn't specify the method to use.)

On Tuesday, October 4th Sue Johnston presented *Five Clubs Making Was a Zero?!*, the first of three lectures on *Finding No Trump Contracts*. A partnership's auctions often start with a minor suit opening bid. If no major suit agreement can be found, how should the bidding proceed? Is a minor suit really the best possible strain? This series provides concepts, tools and practice for finding - or avoiding - no trump contracts in a variety of auction scenarios.

The Lecture Series is on hold until we can schedule meetings in the new Club building. We will resume the series as closely as speakers' schedules will permit.
