We are moving into a much nicer, 1/3 larger facility (old building, but totally new inside). We plan to be there for TWENTY YEARS! (10 year lease, with a

10 year option). It would be great to make it as full-service, practical and appealing a place as possible. A center we can be proud of will keep all of us involved while attracting more people to our favorite game.

Our new landlord is responsible for paying for the basic construction (walls, paint, fixtures like sinks and toilets, etc.). We are responsible for things like carpeting, necessary extra lighting, coffee station, signage, etc. We may be up against additional construction costs as well as additional time needed by the contractors.

We do have money in our account and we can spend some of it. But we need a buffer for contingencies, of which we have a long list, and your donations will provide that buffer.

PROFILE OF VALERIE BALDWIN BY MARY VAN TAMELEN



Birds and bridge.
Those are two passions of our Bridge Center
Board Member Valerie
Baldwin, and she's involved innovatively and creatively in valuable activities with both.

Always interested in birdwatching, Valerie has had pet birds

since she was 13. Now she has three pet parrots of her own and three foster parrots. It was only natural that she became connected with wildlife rescue.

She has worked with wildlife rehabilitation for the past 26 years. More than 10,000 birds have been released over the years in this area. Valerie is cleared for fostering and can teach raptors to hunt and to build muscles for flying before release. She currently has seven species of injured or orphaned birds in five flight cages in her back yard. She takes the non-releasable birds to schools and gives talks about wildlife to students.

Busy as she is with birds, she still has time for bridge. She started with Easy Bridge, graduated to Walter's game, then to tournaments.

At a sectional, she met Ally Whiteneck, a "dynamo," Valerie says, who offered to sell scripts with prepared hands for teaching conventions. That gave our dynamo, Valerie, her idea. Since last March she has set up and run a Saturday morning class. The first half hour

consists of a lecture on the "convention of the day," followed by play. Each table has a mentor. Considering that there are usually 18 to 27 tables, and that seating and mentors are arranged ahead of time, Valerie has her work cut out for her.

She aims for two games a month, covering *Twenty-five Bridge Conventions You Should Know*, by Barbara Seagram. Saturday mornings she's up at 5:30, in the Bridge Center by 8:00. She'll continue "until burn out," she says; we hope she has lots of stamina. Other units are expressing an interest in this format.

Valerie is a native Californian. She earned an MBA at Golden Gate University, and worked as a systems analyst for 13 years at Chevron. Then she decided to become a molecular biologist and went back to San Francisco State for a master's degree. "I'm probably the only person with 13 years of college and no PhD to show for it," she says.

As a molecular biologist she then worked at Stanford, "looking for anti-angiogenic drugs—drugs that block blood vessel formation," useful in fighting cancer.

Retiring in 2004, she became really interested in bridge. Her grandparents in San Rafael had been avid duplicate players, and Valerie had always played bridge occasionally. She became a life master last year. She tries to study bridge at least half hour a day. Along with Fran Bennett, Valerie is the Unit librarian, and the Unit is buying lots of new books for all levels of play. This fits in with Valerie's conviction: "Once you're a life master, you start learning."
