

A WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON AT WALTER U.

The strains of "Pomp and Circumstance" stream through the room. All eyes turn away from the Director toward the back of the room. In full graduation regalia, black gown and tasseled mortar-

board, the gentleman graduate walks solemnly forward. It is an August afternoon at the Unity Church in Palo Alto, the site of Walter Miller's 49er Bridge game. Marcelo Gumucio, the graduate, has earned 50 masterpoints; this marks his final game with the 49er group. Marcelo's friends erupt in good natured laughter both amused at the performance and appreciative of Marcelo's ingenuity. Director Walter greets the graduate and turns the tassel. Applause greets Marcelo as he opens his gown to reveal a unique tee shirt attesting to his graduation from "Walter U."

In the past several months, other satisfied bridge players have "graduated" from Walter's 1 p.m. Wednesday game. Among them, Joanne Jacobs, Patricia Jarman, Agnes Lee and Jo Palermo recall the unique format that Walter offers each afternoon. First, Walter asks if anyone is attending for the first time. If a hand is raised, Walter requests that the person announce his or her name; each individual is welcomed with a round of applause. Walter continues by asking if anyone is present for the second time or the last time. After the director assures the group that they are "the nicest, friendliest bridge players in the world," a 20 minute lesson opens the session, followed by four rounds of duplicate bridge. As the final board of the cycle begins, Walter exhorts his players to get up, walk around, avoid blood clots,

meet new players and enjoy a snack! As a result, most participants socialize with one another, discover new friends and, more important, make arrangements to develop new partnerships at bridge. Following the break, additional boards are played, briefly discussed and passed on to the next table.

In relative obscurity, Walter Miller has been the director of the 49er game for many years. Supporting the value of zero tolerance, Walter emphasizes the practice of excellent decorum at his games, encouraging his nicest, friendliest N/S players to "welcome to our table" their rotating opponents. To some, this seems a juvenile practice, but in Marcelo Gumucio's words, "If you go to a tournament and N/S says 'welcome to our table', you can bet they have been trained by Walter." Gumucio continues: "I call it Walter U. because I learned more than just how to bid a hand. I learned valuable things, such as, bridge etiquette and how to fill out a convention card." To enhance his continuum of lessons, Miller wrote and published his own book, Duplicate Winning Bridge. The lesson of the week is based on a chapter in the text.

Although achieving one's first 50 masterpoints is a bridge milestone, for some leaving Walter's group can be bittersweet. As Marcelo noted, in most games when a director's expertise is required, people will sternly call "DIRECTOR!!" At Wednesday's game, "people's call for the director is 'Director Dear'..." So when Marcelo prepared for his departure from the game, he decided to create a special moment. "I like to have fun," said Marcelo. "In most instances, a name is called, the person stands up and sits down; I wanted this to be special."

Those present on the August afternoon when Marcelo Gumucio graduated will forever recall a unique moment, an appreciative director and the applause and laughter the gesture received. Says Gumucio, speaking for many, "Thank you, Walter, for being my mentor and hundred of others like me."
