WHEN DO WE PLAY TWO BOARDS PER ROUND AND WHEN DO WE PLAY THREE? By Sue Johnston and Lori Spaeth

We have been questioned about why we frequently play two boards per round rather than three in our Wednesday night 199er game. We thought it would be helpful if we explained the reasoning.

Duplicate bridge is based on score comparisons. Ideally, each pair should play each opposing pair and every pair should play every board. Bridge movements are developed with this concept in mind. We choose the movement that provides the best comparison; that is, the movement that gives the fairest results.

The game always begins with the same number of boards on each table. If we start with two boards on each table with 14 tables in play, there are a total of 28 boards being played. Our Wednesday night players play 24 boards; therefore, each pair will play 24/28 of the total boards, or about 86%. Twelve rounds will be played, so each pair will play 12/14 of their opponents, or about 86%. If there is a half-table, sit-out pairs will play 22/28 of the boards and 11/13 of their opponents, or 79% and 85%, respectively. These pairs will sit-out for about 15 minutes.

Look at what happens if we start with three boards on each table. There are now a total of 42 boards in play, and the players will play eight rounds. Pairs that don't sit-out will now play 24/42 of the total boards and 8/14 of the opposing pairs, or about 57%. Sit-out pairs will play 7/13 opposing pairs, or 63%, and 21/42 of the total boards – only half! They will be sitting out for about 21 minutes. If you and your best friends were both sitting North/South in this game, and you went out after the game to compare your scores, you might discover that you had played only six boards in common. If this was the sit-out direction, you might have played only three boards in common! Effectively, you were playing in two different games.

Directors cannot control the number of players coming to our games, but we do have options when choosing the movements we run. In a 24board game with fewer than twelve tables in play, three-board rounds usually provide the best comparison. Eight tables yield the ideal: pairs play all opponents and all boards. With 12 to 15 tables in play, the movements that give the best comparisons are two-board movements. Twelve tables yield the ideal: pairs play all opponents and all boards. With sixteen or more tables – and enough sets of boards – we can split the group into two sections and play three-board rounds. Although not ideal, since pairs will play only half their opponents, in the sixteen-table two-section movement, all pairs will play all the boards.

The classes held at the IFES Hall begin on Thursday, February 2 for 12 weeks through April 26 (except February 16).
