## A Fun, Festive, Fiery Firecracker!

The Unit held its annual FIrecracker at the Santa Clara Convention Center on June 26 - 30. Our tournament was a huge success with 362 players, many coming a long distance to join us, having a lot of fun, facing strong competition and earning master points.

Many, many thanks go to Tournament Chairman Allen Wolman, to his committee chairs and to the many, many members who played and assisted at the event. Also, we're sure the players appreciate the work of Will Watson in posting the results on the Unit web site.

Saturday was the big day with 239 tables and Friday, second with 194.5. The table summary for all the sessions was: Wed., first 91.5, second 75; Thurs., 111, 70; Fri., 126, 92.5; Sat., 132, 113, Sun., 90.5, 83. An encouraging number was the 199er pairs table count, almost 15% higher than last year. The open pairs table count was 315.5, 199er pairs 149.5, 49er pairs 60.5, KO 195 and Swiss 234

### BRIDGE RULED THE DAY.....THE ENTIRE DAY

For bridge players, the Longest Day was a delight from sunrise to sunset with seven consecutive games all day long. The first game began at 5:48 a.m. and the last did not end until after 11 p.m. Randy Ryals, the event coordinator, recruited directors, team members, players and encouraged donations. Together with the other main fundraisers, Carol Kemper and Art Mirin, our Unit raised over \$5,000 for the Alzheimer's Association. The source of these donations was \$4921 donated online, another \$691

cash and check donations on the day of the event, with the Unit donating \$1 per person per game equaling \$234 donated by the Unit.

## FIRECRACKER BENEFITS SECOND HARVEST FOOD BANK

Lothar Klatt and James Stuart-Smith who helped as co-chair for the Second Harvest Food drive enabled the Firecracker to raise about \$6,000. Thanks to the generosity of all who enjoyed the 2013 Firecracker, SHFB's Share Your Lunch program will benefit young people in San Mateo and Santa Clara counties, who rely on school meals; therefore, summer only brings long days filled with hunger.

Chris Bunz designed an eye catching poster and Sioux Atkinson printed them out in large size, 2 ft. by 3 ft. Two ACBL directors, Matt and Brian, were

particularly proactive in promoting cash donations. Our target was \$5,000 and 7 barrels of food. We ended up with something over \$6,000, i.e. \$6,067.01 from cash, check and online donations, and one quarter barrel of food.

In SHFB terms our overall target was 12,950 points and we have raised 14,980 points so far with \$75 in checks in the mail and a quarter barrel of food to be added.

All of their planning and hard work made for a star-spangled event!

Bridge players gathered over a five-day period from June 26-30. For space economy's sake, I'll give the result highlights day by day, noting only those who placed first in A, B or C, or overall in their KO, and naming only those who are Unit 503 members. The 954.5 tables, 104 fewer and 10% lower than the record setting year in 2012, were not as good as was hoped for. As a result, tournament expenses exceeded income by an estimated \$2,600. Interestingly, the pairs game table counts compared favorably with previous years, but the team games count was less than prior every day. The Board is hard at work trying to identify causes and decide how to improve in future years.
