# 2012 UNIT MEMBERSHIP STATISICS BY ELINOR TANCK

The membership is now 968, up by three in the annual October ACBL roster. This change differs significantly from the 7.1% membership increase reported for the October 2011 roster. The ACBL October 2012 QUIP reports the following information: In the last 12 months, the active membership increased 0.3%; the new membership gains were 6.4% and the member losses 5.8%. In all these categories, the Unit ranked 10th, among the 22 units in District 21. The report listed the average member age as 69 and the average years of ACBL membership at 16.

The large increase in the Unit's total masterpoints is the result of the transfer of Hamish Bennett into the Unit. Hamish's 25,446 points tops the list, followed by G. Venkatesh, Malcom McLauglin, Hansa Narasimhan and Gary Macgregor. Randy Rhody is the member at the median and Hugh Dubb is closest to the average masterpoints.

Each October the ACBL issues a Unit membership Excel spreadsheet which is the source of the information in this article and the table below. Note the consistency in the percentage of the residency data.
