### ALL ABOUT LORI SPAETH

There was a time, long ago, when our Bridge Club was just a place where people came to play bridge. At that time there were no lessons for beginners, no flyers about upcoming events, no spirited encouragement for beginners, no outreach.

Then along came Lori.

She just recently started to play bridge herself –it was 1989. She and her husband, Grant, had taken only four lessons in the city, and she says, "I was hooked!" Soon, being Lori, she found herself on the Board as well. A fellow Board member, Atam Latchandani, was responsible for getting her a part-time job at a start-up (Juniper Networks) which turned out to be happy enough for her to stay until she retired in her late forties. "You never know who you're going to meet at the bridge table," she says.

While on the Board, with membership in the club declining, she connected with Frank Smoot, who wanted to "teach a game he loved to people who would use their brains." From the beginning of his classes, Lori was there to help - advertising the lessons in newspapers and flyers, welcoming students, providing snacks, making name tags, being a teacher's aide, keeping track of who came - but, mainly, she was coaxing people to give bridge a try. The word "duplicate" struck fear in many people," she says, but Lori is a great persuader. Between moves, the classes were sometimes homeless, and when held at the Y for a while, they were forced to compete with bongo drums in the next room. When the Bridge Club was established at Terminal Blvd., things really picked up, and there were at one time as many as 92 students with 8 helpers, all solicited and organized by Lori, of course. Sixteen years ago, Lori was appointed Education Liaison to the Board.

Although she will continue to be a resource and to promote bridge to newcomers, she is passing the baton as Education Liaison to Valerie Baldwin in order to spend more time with Grant and her grandchildren. See how bridge education has grown in our Unit during Lori's tenure!

Besides the Unit-sponsored intermediate lessons by Frank, Kathy Harper teaches beginners and basic intermediates on Thursdays and Debbie Rosenberg is teaching advanced techniques. Valerie Baldwin draws a crowd of newer players on Saturdays to learn various conventions.

Education isn't the only field in which Lori has contributed to our Unit. With Sue Johnston, she owns the very same Wednesday night game in which she and Grant began their bridge careers. She has been on the Board and served as President. She was involved in EZ Game and limited games, always encouraging prospective players. She was co-editor of the *Kibitzer* for many years. She worked on practically every move and cleanup, made flyers for parties and special events, and has published the Unit Directory since Linda Spangler left. Oh, and she plays a hell of a good game of bridge herself! All in all, she spends about half her life at the club, always trying to do what's best for the Bridge Center. Being Lori, she credits her accomplishments to the helpfulness and advice of others, including, early on, to Mary Ann Berg, Adrienne Oliff, Frank Smoot, and, recently, to Alan Cummings and Alan Templeton, and "I'm sure I've forgotten others."

"Bridge has enriched my life in so many ways," she says, "most importantly by the wonderful and interesting people I have come to know." She has recently been appointed to the Board of Governors for the ACBL in our district. Being Lori, she will represent us very well.
