He told me that he made the same falsecard 50 years ago

against a famous player that didn't take it as well. He called Bennett a % &\$*%\$ -&%*&\$#-ing Hamish. (That thought had crossed my mind, too.)"

Table Counts

Bridge is really growing in our Unit. In the first seven months of 2013, 5,184 tables of bridge were played at our Bridge Center, an average of 740 tables per month. Compared with 588 tables in the first seven months of 2012, 643 tables in 2011 and 648 tables in 2010, this is the highest seven month total we have had in the last eight years. In addition, during this same period, about 1,600 tables of bridge were played at other facilities (JCC, Unity Church, Vi & Los Altos Country Club), an average of about 225 tables per month.

Education

Our extensive education program is offering outstanding classes to our members, as well as attracting new players to our club. We are very fortunate to have an absolutely first-class group of teachers. So far this year, Debbie Rosenberg, Kathy Harper, Frank Smoot and Valerie Baldwin's Celebrity Series have offered 9 different classes that over 450 of our members attended. All of our teachers are offering new classes in the fall so please check our website for class descriptions and schedules. Unit Games

Under the leadership of Bob Horowitz and Nancy Kehl our Sunday Unit Games have taken on a whole new level of excitement and fun. We have been averaging over 30 tables with both 199er and Open sections.

Firecracker Sectional

Thanks to Allen Wolman and his very large team of volunteers who worked so hard to make our tournament so much fun for all of us. Historically, the Firecracker has been a significant fund-raiser for our unit, but unfortunately the attendance was down from last year so we had a loss. Our team is in the process of reviewing all aspects of the event to see how we can improve the Firecracker for 2014. Our Bridge Center

We have made several improvements to our bridge infrastructure, including upgrading our BridgePads, replacing our bidding box inserts (thanks to a generous donor), installing high-speed internet and adding a new sign above our front door (thanks to Chris Bunz & Sue Griswold). John Mattis continues to work tirelessly to maintain our building and improve our Bridge Center. Please thank him the next time you see him.

Finances

To assist our Treasurer, Todd Makler, our Board established a Finance Committee consisting of Margot Livenspargar, Alan Templeton, Todd Makler and Brian Samuels. A major effort has been made in the last 6 months to reorganize the presentation of our financial data and to create a budget organized around the main financial activities of our Unit. These centers of financial focus are Bridge Center, Firecracker, Education, Unit Games and Member Services.

In order to be financially prudent, our Board approved a financial reserve of 6-months of expenses or about \$65,000. Much like most of us who have an emergency fund for our personal finances, the Unit keeps this money in reserve in case of emergencies.

A few financial facts: it costs about \$350 per day to run our Bridge Center; IFES has recently repaid the \$50,000 loan we made to them as part of our lease agreement; we are currently about \$3,400 positive for Unit operations in 2013; this is about \$4,600 behind our budgeted plan primarily because of a loss of about \$3,000 on the Firecracker and taxes being about \$1,300 more than expected; Education is generating more money than planned; otherwise, expenses and income are pretty much as budgeted.

We have a lot more financial data available to any member who is interested. If you have any questions or would like to be added to the email list for the Board's monthly financial report package, please contact Todd at todd.makler@gmail.com. Todd is currently planning a more detailed financial report for next month's *Kibitzer*.

Parking Problems

Youth Bridge

Thanks to Debbie Rosenberg's leadership, our unit has helped with the start-up of Silicon Valley Youth Bridge (SiVY). Our unit has provided financial support as well as many volunteers.

Decrease in Number of Board Members

As you can read about in another article in this *Kibitzer* the Board has decided to reduce the number of Board members from its current 11 down to 7 by 2015.

Lee Haze is creating a Board of Directors' Manual, which will eventually contain all of our operating policies, as well as any other reference information that a Director might need. This should make it easier for new Directors to get up-to-speed and allow Board members to have all the information they need readily available.

Painting and Carpet Cleaning

While our Bridge Center is closed during the All Western Regional, we will repaint its interior and have the carpets professionally cleaned. After the paint is dry, we will permanently display our Unit award plaques.

Parking Lot Re-Sealing & Re-Striping

We are working with IFES, our landlord, to get our parking lots re-sealed and re-striped. This is a high priority project for us, but we are not able to commit to a schedule. As soon as we can, we will advise all of our members.

Unit Email List

Barbara Shukov is leading a small team to conduct a feasibility study to see if we can create a Unit Email List that could be used for important announcements to our members. It might be possible to combine this with the creation of an online Directory. Regardless, we will continue to produce the printed Directory on an annual basis (and Barbara says with larger print next time).

BOARD REDUCED TO 7 MEMBERS

At its meeting on August 1, our Unit 503 Board decided to reduce its number of members from 11 to 7. The Board made this decision because, with the notable exception of last year, it has been very difficult to get enough people to run for open positions and because our members have been very willing to take on significant responsibilities to help the Unit without needing or even wanting to be on the Board. Also, having 11 members makes the Board less efficient and more difficult to manage.

The Board has decided to accomplish this reduction over a two-year period. There are currently 11 Board members. There will be nine Board members in 2014 and seven Board members in 2015. It was decided to do the reduction gradually to ensure that there are no problems maintaining a quorum (50% of the Board members + 1) at each meeting.

Six members' terms are expiring and they will be leaving the Board at the end of this year. The other five members will remain on the Board for the final year of their terms. We will elect four new members at the end of this year giving the new Board nine members. When the five current members go off the Board at the end of 2014, we will elect three new members, making the total seven for 2015. Since our Bylaws currently state that our Board "needs a minimum of 7 (seven)" members, it is not necessary to have a membership vote to implement this.
