

UNIT LAUNCHED FANTASTIC FIRECRACKER

Cheers, the Unit Firecracker Sectional was successful again with the table count back over the 1000 mark. The June 25-29 tournament held at the Santa Clara Convention Center attracted 1042 tables Particular thanks go to the Tournament Chair James Stuart-Smith and the extraordinary committee chairs. Special appreciation goes to Will Watson for the reports on the Unit website making results quickly and accurately available, Chris Bunz for her flyer design, Polly Siegel and Lori Spaeth for advice on the games schedule, and former chairs, Steve Barasch and Allen Wolman, for recommendations and checking periodically on progress and meeting deadlines. The Unit is also grateful for the dedicated work of the Tournament Director, Nancy Boyd, and all the other ACBL directors who kept the games running smoothly.

Saturday was the big day with 262 tables, the largest single day (by 22 tables) in the past five

years and Friday second with 221. The table summary for all the sessions was: Wed first 80, second 60; Thurs 118, 93; Fri 114, 105, Sat 143, 119, Sun 104.5, 103.5. Some new features to note: the Wednesday count was all pairs, side games were available for single session players, 0-5 masterpoint pairs with youth playing free, and the increased fee to \$11 didn't seem to affect attendance. Out of 1007 youth player sessions, 895 of them won over 3,819 silver points. The tournament chair James-Stuart Smith reports an estimated net income of \$3200. The *Kibitzer* will print a detailed financial report in the September issue.

The Unit News on page 3 gives a report on the success of the Second Harvest Food Bank Drive.

Most of all, James wants to congratulate Unit members for making the event a success by supporting with their participation. "Now we are able to say that Unit 503 sent more members to the Firecracker than any other Unit."

New Free Play Policy - The Unit Board has decided to change the way Free Play Certificates are handled. The Board's intention is to make a Free Play just that - a free play in a club game - independent of the table fee the club owner has decided to charge for that game. Effective immediately, all new and currently in-circulation Free Play Certificates, despite having an \$8 face value, will be accepted by our directors and club owners as FULL PAYMENT for the table fees in any standard club game, or any standard Unit game, for which the table fee is \$9 or \$10. This is despite the fact that the Free Play Certificate states it is worth \$8. Free Play Certificates will not be accepted for payment or partial payment at any special games, i.e. games that have a special surcharge, for example, STAC, charity or other games with a surcharge. Also, effective immediately, Free Plays will be sold for \$10 each, but they will be redeemed according to the above policy.

Second Harvest Food Bank— Lothar Klatt reports that so far the Firecracker received \$4966 in money donations and one full barrel of food. The on-line drive continues for the next month. The *Kibitzer* will have the totals in the September issue.
