Barometer Welcomes 499ers - The forecast is for a good turnout as Will Watson has announced the addition of a 499er section to his Friday Night Barometer game.

Bidding Boxes - Many players have expressed their admiration for the new look to the tables at the Bridge Center. This gives extra space for bridge pads, convention and playing cards.

Defibrillator - At the June meeting, the Board approved the purchase of a defibrillator and the necessary expense to train the game directors and teachers on its use. John Prior has agreed to manage the acquisition and the training.

More NAP - The North American Pairs (NAP) continues during July at the local club level. A player may qualify many times and with many different partners. There will be at least four qualifying games in July: Thursday, July 3 at noon, Thursday Afternoon BC; Wednesday, July 9 at 11 a.m., Bridge 'n Brunch; Wednesday, July 16, at 7 p.m. Doubleton BC and Friday, July 18 at 7:30 p.m., Barometer BC. Remember to make a reservation for the Doubleton BC which is a very popular game. Watch the *Kibitzer* and the Unit website for other announcements of NAP games. The masterpoint strata are: A (unlimited), B (0-2500), C (0-500 Non-Life Masters).

Library - Barry Rigal plans to write a four-book series on card play. Our library already has the book *Breaking the Rules: First Hand Play*. Now the author, along with co-author Josh Donn, has published the second book, *More Breaking the Rules: Second Hand*

Play. The more one plays bridge, the more one realizes that the rules that govern the game don't always work. After reading this book, you'll realize that context determines whether or not you should follow the general principles that operate successfully more often than not. You'll find this book in our Unit Library.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I was reading the June Bridge Bulletin and on page 28 they list the top 50 clubs in 2013. The ranking seems to be based on the number of tables. I looked to see where our club was and was quite surprised to see that it didn't make the list at all. I was under the impression that we were an unusually large club, Are these rankings correct? I am asking because I'm curious how the numbers are obtained.

The question was forwarded to Lori Spaeth, who responded as follows:

That's a very good question. My guess is the games held at the Bridge Center have many sanctions (different owners) and each sanction is counted separately. In actuality, the Bridge Center, California (?) is listed as #47 with 5900.5 games - probably the Monday game at the Bridge Center and the Thursday game at the JCC (both under the same sanction number). Other units' games are under one umbrella; thus they get to count all their tables.

If we combined all of the games held just at the Bridge Center in 2013, we would have been 14th in the country with 9,086.5. It does beg the question...could the ACBL count the Bridge Center as one place for bridge so that people around the globe would know how big we are? Perhaps someone should follow up with them to see if it's possible. (Editor's Note: President Brian Samuels did follow up with the ACBL and confirmed that table counts are indeed decided by sanction. Oh well ;-))

BIG Success for Learn Bridge in a Day

At 9:15 a.m. on Saturday, June 14, our Bridge Center was mobbed with eager people waiting to check in for Learn Bridge in a Day (LBIAD). By 9:30, most were seated and ready for five hours of learning our game. The B.C. was filled to capacity with approximately 154 students and 40 mentors. Eleven of the participants were youth. The youngest player, Alex, age 10, came to help his newbie mom learn the game.

Just look at the terrific Roy Robinson photo above. We've seen full houses before, but usually the faces are a bit more familiar. How gratifying it was to see this wonderful response to our promotional efforts.

Thanks to a grant from the ACBL Educational Foundation, Patty Tucker, author of LBIAD, flew in from Atlanta, GA to teach the seminar. She started from the very beginning: how to deal the cards, major and minor suits, winning tricks, declarer and dummy, trumps and notrump. By the first "snack break," participants were counting points in their hands and learning how to bid. By the end of the day, everyone had learned enough to play a few predealt hands and then some shuffled and dealt hands.

The enthusiasm in the room was contagious, and Patty, an entertaining teacher. On final, written evaluations, participants were lavish in their praise for Patty, the class, and especially the table mentors who

patiently explained and helped them with their bids and play. Patty remarked that our Unit's LBIAC was the second largest she has ever taught. We'd like to invite Patty Tucker back for a second Learn Bridge in a Day . Our ACBL grant paid for one trip only. If you have airline miles you could donate, please talk to Carolyn Chaney.

We certainly hope that we will see many of these new players back again at our bridge center, enrolled in our classes, playing in our easy game, participating in our SiVY bridge programs, and perhaps trying the 0-5 game at the Firecracker.
