BYLAWS UPDATE BY JODY WILLIAMS

The Board of Directors initiated a project in 2013 to revise the Unit's bylaws. The Board has approved the revisions which the membership must now ratify before they are adopted. The revisions fall into three categories: finance and accounting, open government, and cleanup.

Motivation for the Changes

Finance and Accounting

The most substantial change is the requirement that the Unit operate on a budget. In years when the Board did not use a budget, disagreements arose about the way money was allocated and the process for approving new spending. The budget resolves most of these situations because interested parties have the opportunity to participate in the creation of the budget. The process for handling requests that break the budget was also added to the bylaws. In years when the Board has not used a budget, spending decisions were made on a case by case basis as the need for funds arose.

Open Government

Changes to the bylaws with respect to open gov-

ernment are to clearly state the requirements for agendas and forums. For example, the bylaws have not been updated since electronic communication has become prevalent. The changes are designed to ensure that Unit business is conducted in an open forum where Unit members have the opportunity to participate in forming the plans and actions of the organization.

Cleanup

Cleanup changes should be largely self-explanatory. In some cases words were missing, there were typos, information appeared in multiple sections of the bylaws where it should have been consolidated, etc.

More Information

Please look at the web site for more detailed information before the Q and A session being held on Sunday, May 4 at 12:15 p.m. before the Unit Game. The Board will hold more sessions, as needed, to give everyone the opportunity to provide input on the changes. The date for the membership vote depends on the number of question and answer sessions. The membership vote will be by ballot. The bylaws update will be approved if 2/3rds of the votes are in favor.
