# NAP Finals in Palo Alto In Early 2016

Our Unit is honored to be hosting the District 21 NAP (North American Pairs) finals in January and February for the very first time. We are extremely pleased to host and hope this will encourage many of our members to qualify and compete this year.

What's that about, you may ask? Well, the NAP finals are the last step in choosing the three top finishers from our district in Open and four top finishers in B and C. Those players will then be invited to attend the NABC in Reno in March, 2016, with monetary awards to be given by the ACBL.

To prepare for those finals our clubs are holding special NAP qualifying games now and through August. The terminology may be a bit confusing: since our games are owned by individuals, each director's games are technically a "club." For example, the Wednesday night Doubleton "Club" is holding an NAP qualifier on August 5; the Friday Night Barometer "Club" has scheduled a qualifier for July 31. The Saturday One Club qualifiers will be on August 8 and 29. Ask your director/club owner about additional qualifiers for August. The players who qualify at the Club level can then play in a Unit level NAP game, planned for December 13, to try for the finals; the hope is that LOTS of us will qualify.

**Unit Games:** August Unit games are scheduled for Saturday, August 1st at noon and Sunday, August 23 at 1:00 p.m. As is customary, the Saturday pairs game will include a Mentor/Mentee section if enough pairs sign up. The Sunday game is a team game. Lunch precedes both games. In September, the dates are Saturday, the 12th and Sunday, the 20th, with the same formats as in August. Be sure to sign up!

#### RECENT BOARD ACTIVITIES

The 2015 Firecracker Sectional ran very smoothly and raised \$5,700 for Second Harvest Food Bank. We all owe a special thank you to Gill and Paul Barsley for their superb work organizing and managing this event. For reasons we do not fully understand, table counts were down this year, leaving us with a deficit of approximately \$2,500 (not all the expenses have yet been received). Since most of the Firecracker expenses are fixed, we are almost completely dependent on strong table counts for adequate revenue.

Planning for the 2016 Firecracker is underway. The Santa Clara Convention Center is not available for the dates we need next year, so we are likely to hold the event at the IFES Hall next door along with our own space at the Bridge Center. This venue will pose some new challenges, but it will also be less expensive, so the issue of table counts will be less critical. We have reserved the space for next June.

The upcoming elections and the NAP finals to be held in Palo Alto in January/February were also discussed. Reports of these can be found on page 1.

#### FIRST AID COURSE FOR MEMBERS

Last year our Unit acquired an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and other materials for a first aid program, and it is now offering a second series of a Red Cross training course available at no cost to Unit members who play at the Bridge Center at least once a week.

In many cases, the minutes between the onset of a medical emergency and the arrival of emergency medical personnel after a 911 call are a critical time that can make the difference between a full recovery for the sufferer and something less. Early intervention can sometimes save a life.

The course consists of 2.5 hours of online study and 2 hours of in-class skills training, the latter to be held at the Bridge Center on Tuesday evenings. Here is a description from the Red Cross website:

The Adult First Aid/CPR/AED course incorporates the latest science and teaches students to recognize and care for a variety of first aid emergencies such as burns, cuts, scrapes, sudden illnesses, head, neck, back injuries, heat and cold emergencies and how to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies for victims about 12 years and older. Successful students will receive a certificate for Adult

First Aid/CPR/AED valid for two years. This course combines online learning and a classroom skills session. Online learning must be completed prior to attending the classroom session. Details will be included via email once you register. This course will not work in Google Chrome.
