Thanks to everyone who gave input on budget decisions. We are happy to report that we have balanced the budget for 2016. We took three major steps to make this happen:

1. The feedback on having a pot luck for the Christmas party was so favorable that we decided to do it for both 2015 and 2016 for a savings of \$2800 per year. For 2015, Nancy Kehl will organize volunteers to provide side dishes and the Unit will provide the main course. Nancy does a terrific job and we hope you will give her a lot of support.

2. Valerie Baldwin has lined up a weekend with Barbara Seagram as our second guest speaker, which should contribute nicely to our bottom line. Valerie and Carolyn Chaney have organized or coorganized our special education events over the last several years. They do an enormous amount of work to make this happen.

3. We added conservative estimates of income that will be generated by two upcoming events at the Bridge Center: the NAP district finals January 24 and the NLM Sectional January 30-31. Thanks to Alan Cummings for coming up with the idea for the sectional and doing a great job of recruiting and organizing all of the volunteers who are helping with this.

- 4. Other financial news:
 - Your feedback helped us decide what to do with the youth discount and the directory. Several of you wanted to preserve the youth discount as did a majority of the club owners and your president. We will continue to give the discount, but only for students under 26. All of the feedback on the directory was to go digital. We will not publish a printed directory in 2016.
 - SiVY has volunteered to pay for use of the Bridge Center for its pizza parties, etc. Thank you!
 - We are gaining momentum on the Firecracker. Anne Keyser will chair the food committee and Tom Quinlan will help James Stuart-Smith with tournament planning. We're still looking for someone to take charge of parking because it looks like we'll need to

LECTURE SERIES

Our Education Fund needs \$4,000/year to fully fund our lecture series and book purchases. In October we sent out an email asking for contributions to fund operations in 2016. WE HAVE A BRAND NEW BOARD!

Six candidates have just been elected to twoyear terms on the 2016 Unit 503 Board of Directors. Three are new Board members, Gill Barsley, Peggy Chen and Marolyn Imaoka. Hearty congratulations to you all! And three incumbents, Leslie Altick, Jim Harris and Jody Williams were elected to a second term...congratulations to them as well.

There were 77 valid ballots cast. Ten other ballots were invalid and not counted. Of the invalid ballots, five voted for more than six candidates, two were not signed and three were cast by voters not on the current membership roster. Here are the results: Leslie Altick and Marolyn Imaoka , 70 votes; Gill Barsley and Peggy Chen, 68 votes; Jody Williams, 67 votes; Jim Harris, 66 votes. Steve Lubeck (write in), 1 vote.

These six join three returning Board members, Paul Davis, Todd Makler, and David Puryear. Board officers for 2016 will be elected by the 2016 Board at its December 7th meeting, which will include the new Board members. Officers for 2016 will assume their responsibilities on January 1.

Margot Livenspargar, our Goodwill Ambassador By Judi Gentry



Last year our Margot Livenspargar received District 21's Goodwill Ambassador award. Here's what was given to me as chairman of the Recognition Committee as criteria for the Goodwill Ambassador award, given by District 21. The Dis-

trict specifies that the recipient should be "someone who has helped promote bridge in several ways. It should be an individual who you would enjoy playing with or against at the bridge table. This person may have helped to increase your local membership or have made many contributions in the background but always in a friendly manner. Long time volunteers who are eternally cheerful would be great candidates."

Margot's life prepared her to be a Goodwill representative. As the daughter of a career military father and the wife of a military man, Margot was quite accustomed to picking up and moving to a new location. She had to learn the customs and behaviors of new places, make new friends, adapt to new environments and figure out how to instill goodwill around the world. Bridge was one of the tools for her to accomplish this task. When Margot graduated from high school, one of the things her father did to prepare her for college was to teach her bridge. What a gift that was for her – and ultimately for so many of us. She played a little when she was a student at Northwestern. When she married, she found that bridge helped her get to know the other spouses on whatever military base she was on at the time. In the 70s she discovered duplicate bridge while living in New Mexico. Then she learned that they were being transferred to Okinawa. She checked to see that there was a duplicate club there, but that they didn't have an instructor. She prepared herself by getting a director's certificate before leaving and ran bridge classes in the bridge club in Okinawa.

After living all over the world and in many US states, Palo Alto Bridge Club is lucky that Margot chose to settle in our area. She provides this club with much more than her bridge expertise. Margot really is a role model of how a bridge player should behave. She shows ultimate respect for her partners and opponents. At the table, she is thoughtful, calm and has a ready smile for others. Margot is not the kind of person who puts herself first or promotes her presence. She quietly, but quite strategically fills the gaps where something is needed. She has served as secretary of the board, directs special games and always supports other directors in their difficult task. For the past two years, since its inception, she has been an instructor and active advocate of SiVY Bridge (Silicon Valley Youth Bridge.) This program offers free after school bridge classes, clubs, events, and other opportunities for youth to play bridge and improve their skills. Margot teaches weekly classes in local schools for youth. She surely provides these young players with more than the basics. They have a wonderful role model of how to behave as a bridge player.

Margot is a citizen of the world. She has a trail of friends all over the planet, many in the bridge world. She now divides her time between the bay area, Apple Valley (where her daughter and 2 grandsons live) the Sacramento area (which is home to her son and <u>great</u> grandkids), and reunions with friends in various other locations. Palo Alto is fortunate she still calls our club home.

CALENDAR OF EVENTS....

December 13 NAP Unit Qualifier: - This year we encourage eligible Unit 503 players to put this on their schedule because our Center is hosting the District Finals in January and February.

If you qualified for this NAP (North American Pairs) event during the summer at a club game, you are eligible to play in this event. The posted results show a "Q" by the pairs who have qualified. Both members of a pair qualify (or not) individually. You do not need to play with the same partner, but you do need to play with a partner who has also qualified. The results show three qualifying columns, corresponding to the three flights (A, B, and C). A pair can qualify by finishing in the top half of the field in their strata. A "C" pair can qualify for all three levels of play if they finish in the top half of all players, but a player must choose one level of competition for Unit Qualifying and the District Finals. Top District pairs receive a stipend toward expenses to compete at Nationals

The December 13 NAP Unit Qualifier is a twosession event being held on the same day as one of our regular Unit Games. The Unit Game is a single session with a limited section as well as an open section. Both games begin at 1p.m. on Sunday, December 13.

For those who are successful at the 12/13 Qualifier, the NAP District Finals are at our Bridge Center on January 23-24, 2016 for Flights A and C and on February 6, 2016 for Flight B.

Larry Cohen returns - On May 21-22, 2016, Larry Cohen will return to our Center for two more seminars. Topics will be announced well in advance and sign-ups will begin in the spring. Last year his seminars were a huge success.

Barbara Seagram visits - On September 24-25, 2016, Barbara Seagram, popular author of many bridge books, will present two seminars. Her topics will be announced in advance and sign-ups will begin in the summer.
