The Committee on the Future of the Firecracker will hold its first meeting on March 9 after the Monday game (approximately 3:00). Anyone interested in joining this group is welcome. The Bridge Center cannot function without volunteers and this is just one of many opportunities to contribute your time and expertise.

The Board made the following decisions during this meeting:

 We will explore hosting future Grand National Pairs and Teams events (in 2016) if the financial is-sues can be worked out.

 We will provide Recognition Packets for members who transfer into our unit as well as those new to the ACBL.

We authorized funds for free play prizes for unit games and unit-sponsored events such as Learn Bridge in a Day.

• We clarified our policy on fees for private lessons at the Bridge Center: the standard fee will apply (currently \$3 per person) but use of the Center is not exclusive and is limited to times when the Center is open.

© We voted to provide \$275 to the Stanford University Bridge Team which has qualified for the Collegiate Nationals. The funds will buy a new set of boards and tee shirts for the team members to wear during the competition. The shirts will acknowledge Palo Alto Unit in some way.

Remember, you have a partner by D.K.

- You are South. You hold ♦QJ10xxx ♥Kxx ♦x
 ♦AQx and open: S W N E
 - 1S x xx 3C
 - 4S p p p

Your partnership has an agreement that in this sequence xx shows 10+ points and nothing about distribution. When South bid 4S, he forgot that he had a partner and decided to jump to game all by himself. Had he remembered that he had a partner he would have doubled 3C or passed and let partner decide what to do next. South was down 4 in 4S. Had he chosen either of those bids, the opponents would have been down 3 doubled in any contract they chose. South is a veteran LM.

2. South, holding ♦A10x ♥Kxxx ♦Axx ♦AKQx opens:

S W N E 2NT p 3C 3D P 3H 3NT 4H 4S p p p

Until the last bid, South, a Gold Life Master, has described his hand perfectly. North knows that South has 20 high card points, a balanced hand and does not have 4 spades. South does not know what North has, so South should let partner make the decision. The 4 spade bid keeps partner from bidding, the result being South is down **4**.

3. And now something for when you remember and trust your partner...

West: deals and opens the bidding:

W N E S 1D p 1S p 2S p 4S p p p

You are South holding $\Rightarrow xxx \Rightarrow AJxx \Rightarrow Qxxxx \Rightarrow x$, and you lead the singleton club. North wins with the club A and returns the club 10. Now what? Generally (by agreement) the return of a high card means partner wants the higher suit, but there is a singleton heart in dummy and you have the ace. If you trust partner, you must under lead your heart A and you will be rewarded with another club ruff.
