RECYCLING LESSON 1A BY PAUL DAVIS

It turns out that we at the Bridge Center produce a lot of trash. and that this has become something of an issue with our landlord because they often have to order a second pick up that costs them a lot of money. Further, those of us who've been diligently separating out recyclables from trash are disheartened to learn that it was all for naught. It turns out that Gilbert, who cleans our facility, has been putting all of the recycling into the garbage because ... there were no recycle bins.

Being who we are, the Board is working to fix all of this. Kevin ordered a free recycle bin from Recology and we've asked IFES to order a compost bin from Recology that we will pay for. Dave Wheeler purchased new receptacles for compost.

Being who *they* are, our players have been highly receptive but full of questions and suggestions. Gilbert notes that Recology won't take our recycling if it includes any food or plastic (especially forks). So we must be much more careful about what goes into which bin. *Only recyclable materials, i.e., paper, go into the recycling bin.* No food there, please. Players want more signage and clarity on what goes where.

We've looked into compostable forks and spoons but they are twice as expensive as the plastic we now use. Kevin O'Leary and I think we should get stainless flatware and wash it. FIRECRACKER 2016 — IN JEOPARDY

Since the costs associated with renting the Convention Center have risen dramatically, we are planning to hold next year's Firecracker at the Bridge Center and concurrently at the adjacent IFES hall. The two spaces provide an area similar to what we have used in Santa Clara and should work well. But that decision, while solving the financial issue, brings up other dilemmas which are preventing us from deciding definitely on Firecracker plans — primarily whether to even hold it and if so, for how long.

At this time, in order to make a commitment to hold the Firecracker, we need a chair for indoor/outdoor space planning, a person to coordinate parking and a food committee guru. OUR TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE

Is HARD AT WORK

The Technology Committee met August 24 after the Monday game and identified many opportunities to improve and consolidate the software we use. You will find below some of the many areas which we would like to start working on now and with which we need a little help.....

Reservation system - Several of the games at the bridge center are reaching capacity. It would be more efficient for players if the online reservation system were the same for all games requiring reservations.

Calendar - A wide variety of people schedule events at the Bridge Center. Sounds easy, but it's not; avoiding conflicts with other uses and large events at the IFES is quite complicated. We have had some fairly serious conflicts in the past, and technology should be able to help solve the problems.

Website Upgrade -The technology behind our website is out of date. Upgrading is necessary because while Alan Templeton does (and has done for years....thank you, Alan) a terrific job, we need to make sure we can operate effectively if he were no longer available to be the Webmaster. Upgrading would also have significant benefits to members. For example, with more modern technology all of the web pages can resize automatically to fit whatever device people are using to view them.

Quick Books - We use personal checkbook software for our financial information. As with the website, we need to provide a platform that is operating system independent, accessible by Unit board members, and backed up automatically into a Unit-accessible location.

Additional opportunities for technological improvement and for your help include: **Pianola**. This software is used by many ACBL districts and units, although not currently by us. It provides features for club owners and members such as mailing list management, hand analysis, a partnership desk, etc. Bill Bailey volunteered to set up Pianola for our Unit so that we may take advantage of the two year free trial offered by the ACBL.

The late Terence Reese introduced the "over-the-shoulder" style of bridge writing in his classic *Play These Hands With Me*. Horton uses this style in his book, leading the reader through a logical line of play on each instructive deal, but usually a line that ends in failure. In each post-mortem, the "expert" realizes how he could have improved on his play, and (usually) made his contract.

Our Unit Library has also recently acquired Brent Manley's new book *The Smart Guide to Bridge*. This guide is designed to help bridge players at all stages of their development.
