


Opening with a balanced hand – the whole kit & kaboodle Don't hold your breath waiting for 28+ HCP – about 1 hand in 35,000




The "NT Opening Ladder"






Bidding after Partner opens NT



Fleshing that out ... after Partner opens 1NT

6+ card Major \rightarrow play in that Major \rightarrow (1) Transfer, then (2) Pass, Invite, or Bid Game



If balanced – I Pass with 8 HCP ... and ... Invite with 9 HCP

Partner opens 1NT – and you are Balanced, with no 4+ card Major

My philosophy: Pass with 8 HCP, and Invite with 9 HCP

(partner accepts with 16 or 17)

Many people invite with 8 <u>or</u> 9, and accept with 17 (or a "good" 16)

Why do I prefer my philosophy ?

• It leads to fewer "2NT, down 1" contracts when Opener has 15 HCP (see Appendix)

If balanced – Pass with 8 HCP ... and ... Invite with 9 HCP
